PVT. WILLIAM KERCSMAR

Mr. and Mrs. Alexander Kercsmar, 639 Williams Street, received a telegram from the War Department, dated July 8, which informed them that their son, Pvt. William Kercsmar, serving with the Infantry, was wounded in action on June 10 in France, sustaining nose injuries due to a shell concussion.

Pvt. Kercsmar is presently a patient in a British hospital, and there celebrated his nineteenth birthday on June 26. He was inducted into the armed forces on September 13, 1943, and received his basic training at Camp Van Dorn, Mississippi. From there he was transferred to Fort Dix, N. J., and in late March was moved to England.

Pvt. Kercsmar attended Washington Junior High School, is a member of St. John's Windish Lutheran Church and prior to his induction was employed by the Duval Furniture Company.
