## Marion Muhr Is Bride of Naval Ensign

At a double ring ceremony Sunday at 2 p. m. in St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Miss Marion Muhr, only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Muhr, of 1324 Broadway, became the bride of Ensign Charles S. Redline, U. S. Naval Reserve, only son of Mr. and Mrs. Claude S. Redline, of 819 Tombler Street. Rev. Dr. Corson Snyder performed the ceremony. The chancel and church were decorated with palms and chrysanthemums.

Given in marriage by her father, the bride wore a gown of white slipper satin, with medallions of lace at neckline and scattered throughout the skirt and train. Her veil was of bridal illusion of fingertip length with illusion sweetheart bonnet edged in lace and she carried a white Bible with an orchid marker and streamers of bouvardia.

Her attendants were gowned in jewel tones. Mrs. John Muhr, sister-in-law of the bride, was matron of honor. She was attired in ruby red taffeta with matching ostrich plumes in her hair and matching draped veil fascinator and carried a bouquet of yellow chrysanthemums.

Miss Helen Redline, sister of the bridegroom, and Miss Dorothy Muhr, niece of the bride, were bridesmaids. Miss Redline wore topaz gold taffeta and Miss Muhr emerald green. Both wore matching ostrich plumes and fascinators and carried bouquets of bronze chrysanthemums.

Mary Ann Muhr, niece of the bride, as flower girl, wore white taffeta with matching bows in her hair and carried a colonial bouquet of fuchsia daisies and yellow pompons.

Merritt Deysler, brother-in-law of the bridegroom, was best man and Corp. Walter Muhr and John Muhr, brothers of the bride, served as ushers.

Miss Marion Beck, organist, gave a recital before the service and accompanied the soloist, Mrs. William Doorley, who sang "At Dawning," "I Love You Truly" and "Because." Miss Beck's numbers included: "Andante," 6th Organ Sonata (Mendelssohn); "Theme From Finlandia," (Sibelius); "Pastoral," (Mozart); "Stille Wie Die Nacht," (Bohm); "The Harp," (Morrison); "Andante," Nocturne in F (Schumann), and the traditional wedding marches.

A reception for the immediate families of the bride and bridegroom was held at the Windish Lutheran Hall after which the couple left for Norfolk, Va., where Ensign Redline will await further orders.

Mrs. Redline is a graduate of Fountain Hill High School and Cedar Crest College, class of 1942, where she majored in home economics. She was active in the Home Economics Club, Crestiad, college newspaper, Espejo, year book, Athletic Association, YWCA and the choir. She was recently elected secretary of the local branch of the Pennsylvania State Education Association. She is foods and vocational home economics instructor in Northampton High School.

Ensign Redline is a graduate of Bethlehem High School and Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science, Class of 1940, where he was active in the band and Upsilon Sigma Phi Fraternity. March 1, 1941, he enlisted in the U. S. Naval Reserves and served as pharmacist at the Philadelphia Naval Hospital unit until he took up the V-7 course at Notre Dame. He received his commission as ensign in January. At the University of Notre Dame he was head bandmaster.

Ensign Redline was home on a 15-day leave, having just returned from the African, Sicilian and Italian theaters of war. Mrs. Redline will resume her teaching duties December 20. She will reside with her parents on Broadway.
