They are brothers-in-law and it was their first meeting in 18 months. The former is doing his bit in the U. S. Navy; the latter affiliated with a Seabee unit. The meeting was accidental. The boat on which Fleming is a crew member landed at a certain island, "way down under," where he met Green, and after a period of reminiscing, they boarded the ship and enjoyed Navy chow. Both were recently advanced to their present rank. A graduate of Liberty High School, Green was inducted nine months ago. Fleming attended Bethlehem Catholic High School and enlisted 18 months ago. Both are former employes of the Bethlehem Steel Company.
