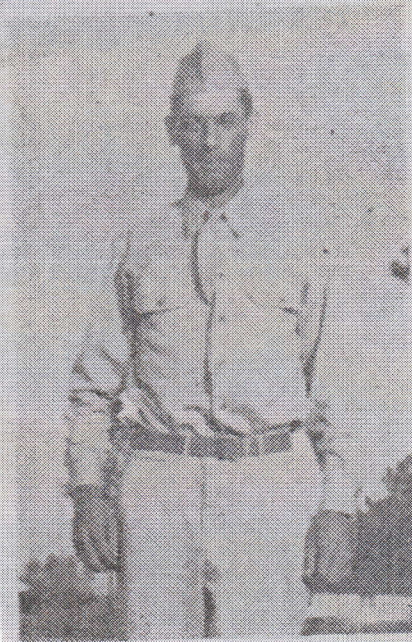
Killed In Germany On Day Mother Dies Here; Brother Loses Life In Action Previous Month

For the third time in less than three months, death has struck the home of George Younger, 64 West Raspberry Street, veteran of World War I, as he was informed that a stepson, Pfc. Edward Rowe, had been killed in action in Germany on December 11, the day the boy's mother died in this city. On November 4, another stepson, Pfc. George P. L. Rowe, was killed in action.

Pfc. Edward F. Rowe enlisted March 29, 1944 and received his basic training at Camp Blanding, Fla., before going overseas in September. Surviving him are his wife, Mrs. Marybelle 808½ Evans Street, and three children: Edward Jr., Richard and Marybelle, and the following brothers and sisters: Mrs. Sarah Cavey, Mrs. Russell Cavey, Mrs. Norman Traop, Mrs. Earl Laub, Helen, Pauline, and Martha Younger and Pfc. Walter R. Rowe, somewhere in Germany.

Both boys had been graduates of Bethlehem High School. Edward was formerly employed by the Bethlehem Foundry Machine Company and George at the Bethlehem Steel Company.
