Pfc. Floyd Stahl, Bangor Soldier, Is Missing

Word was received yesterday noon by Mrs. Esther Stahl, of Meyers Crossing, that her husband, Pfc. Floyd Stahl of the United States Army, is missing in action in Normandy, France, as of July 5.

Pfc. Stahl, who is 35 years of age, was one of the best players in the old Northampton County Baseball League. He played for Bangor, Stockertown, Roseto, Wind Gap and ~~West~~ Bangor.

The telegram from the War Department to Mrs. Stahl was signed by Ulio, Adj. General and indicated that if any further information relative to her husband becomes available, she would be notified immediately.

He entered the United States Army on September 11, 1943, through New Cumberland Replacement Center and from there joined the Infantry of the United States Army at Camp VanDoren, Mississippi. From that camp he was sent to Camp Breckenridge, Kentucky and from there overseas to England in April, 1944. The last letter Mrs. Stahl received from her husband was dated, July 3.

Prior to his induction, Pfc. Stahl was employed as head painter by the Lehigh Portland Cement Company and there entered the employment of the Hercules Powder Company at Belvidere, N. J., as a guard.
