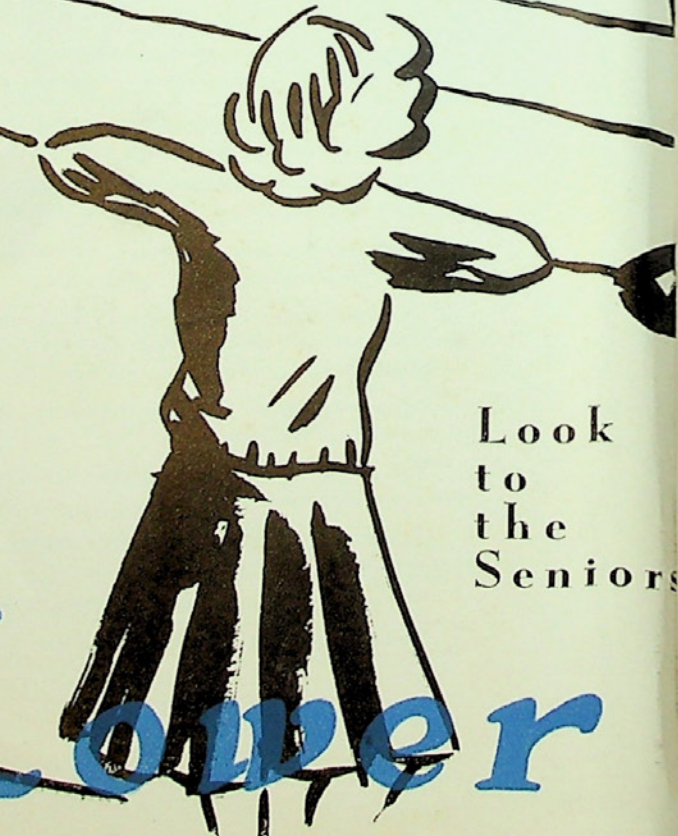
We are indebted to William Kilpatrick, our photographic editor, for the many fine photographs of pupils in candid pose.

The 1946-47 basketball squad of Bethlehem High School can look back on the present season as one of the finest in local high school cage history.

Under the capable direction of Coach Joseph Preletz, the Red Hurricane won twenty-one games and lost four. During this time, they accumulated 1,433 points—a greater number than any other team in Bethlehem High history.

Three of their four losses came at the hands of Allentown High's state champions; however, the fourth loss was a rather shocking one at the hands of Allentown Central Catholic by the score of 41-39. The Liberty boys avenged this loss on two occasions when they defeated the Central Catholic team by the scores of 55-33 and 62-44.

Late in December they brushed aside all opposition to win the First Lehigh Valley Scholastic Tourney in Rockne Hall by defeating South Whitehall 60-26, Northampton 60-41, and in the finale Central Catholic by the score of 55-33.

On two occasions this season, Bethlehem journeyed to Penn Palestra in Philadelphia to meet Allentown High School to decide the winner of the East Penn championship. On March 3, Bethlehem defeated the Canaries by the score of 57-42 to win the championship for the second half. On March 5, Allentown retaliated and defeated the Bethlehem boys by the score of 56-43 to win the East Penn Championship for the 1946-47 season.

High scorers for the Hurricane for the season were Bill Werpehoski with a total of 262 and Cary Smith who tallied 254 points for the season.

On April 10, at the American Hotel, a dinner was held in honor of the team. At that time, George Marinkovich was honored as the most valuable player on the 1946-47 squad.

Of the sixty-four prospects, nine of them were members of last year's championship team. They were the following:

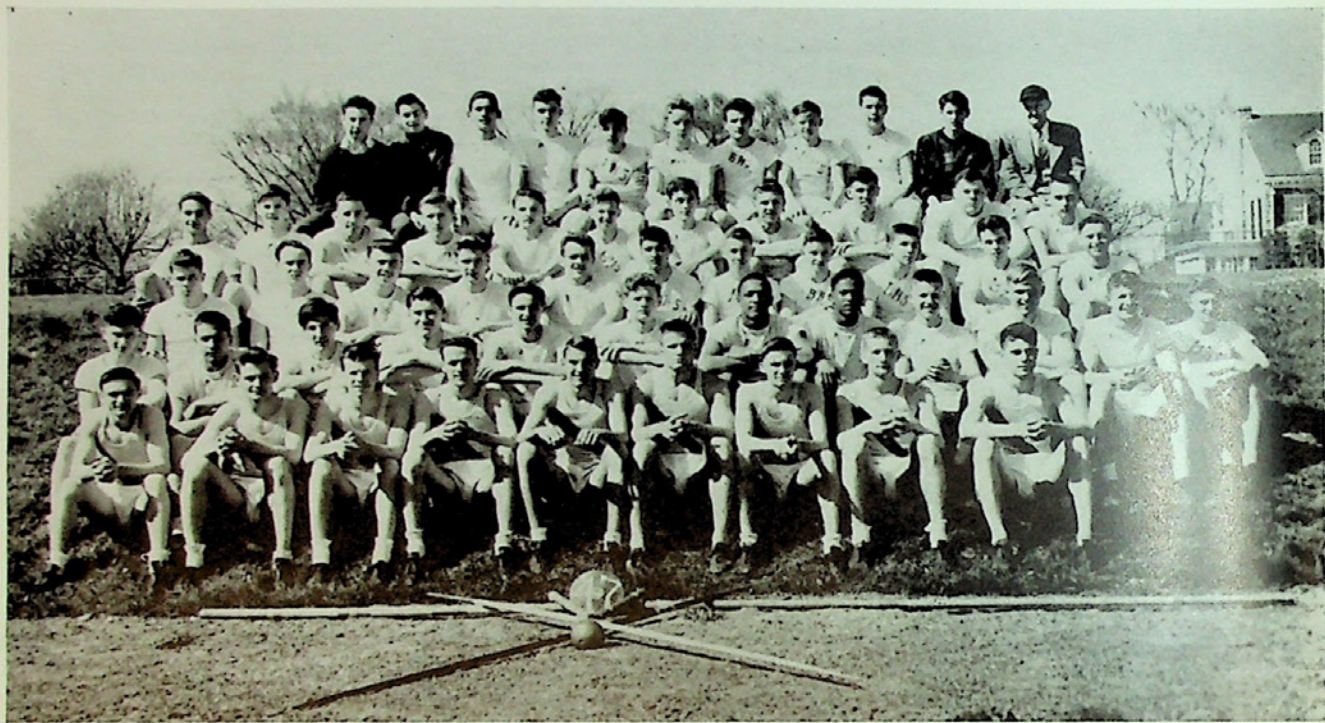

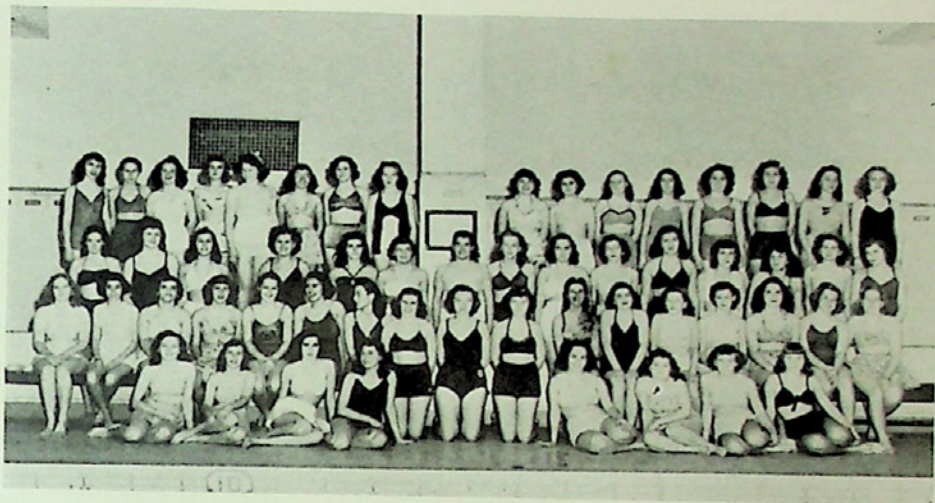

Every Tuesday afternoon a business meeting was held, after which all members enjoyed themselves in recreational swimming.

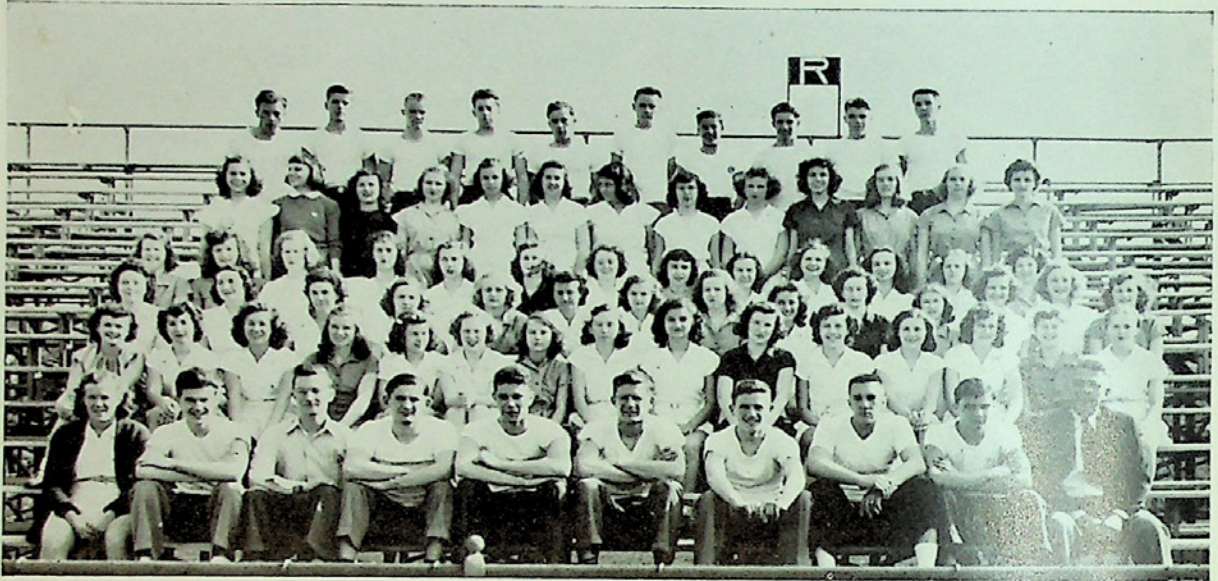
