Three Brothers Win Promotion in Service

The three young servicemen pictured above are sons of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Ford, 415 Adams Street, Bethlehem, and each has been advanced in grade in his particular service. Patrick, at the left, is now a seaman second class and is at Sampson, N. Y., awaiting orders. He recently spent a week at home upon the completion of his basic training at the Sampson Naval Base. He enlisted June 25.

James, in the center, has been made a sergeant and is at Camp Shenango expecting orders for overseas duty soon. He was inducted last February, sent to New Cumberland and thence to Camp Wheeler, Ga. He is a former employee of the Bethlehem Steel Company.

Mark, at the right, is now a corporal and is swimming instructor at Camp Pickett, Va., where he is a member of an anti-aircraft outfit. Mark went from New Cumberland to Ft. Eustis, Va., then to Chicago, where he graduated from the Coyne Electrical School; then to California and now is back in Virginia, a regular "Cook's Tour." He was inducted November 7, 1942 and is also a former Steel Company employee.

A fourth brother, Thomas, is with an armored infantry unit at Camp Chaffee, Ark. He was inducted in May. He, too, is an ex-employee of the Steel firm.
