DR. CHARLES E. CHAFFEE Superintendent of Schools

During the past three years, the class of 1964 has witnessed a 26.4 per cent increase in Liberty's student enrollment. It is through this major development that Dr. Chaffee, Superintendent of Schools, is identified with the class. He served as coordinator when the Bethlehem City Area Union School District, including Bethlehem City, Bethlehem Township, and Freemansburg Borough, was formed in July of 1962. On May 21, 1963, citizens of the community endorsed the eight million dollar bond issue for the expansion of secondary school facilities. As a result, Dr. Chaffee is currently involved in intensive preplanning for renovations at Liberty and for the proposed senior and junior high schools.

In his executive position, Dr. Chaffee cooperates with the Board of School Directors to expand facilities and to raise academic standards throughout the school district.

Mr. Klein, too, has had added responsibility because of the increase in both student body and faculty. This year, the principal inaugurated the eight period day, remedying many overcrowded conditions and enabling more students to study electives in addition to the required courses. Complete integration of the high school in all academic areas was accomplished this past year by the principal and his assistant.

Mr. Klein is prominent not only as an administrator but also as a citizen interested in each student and that student's place in an ever-growing community.


MR. JOSEPH J. McINTYRE Assistant Principal



Liberty Life staff members seek out news and organize the diversified events of a high school community into an accurate, interesting newspaper. For the ninth consecutive year Columbia Scholastic Press Association awarded Liberty Life first place honors. The newspaper also captured a blue ribbon in the national Tuberculosis Society Contest. Equally as important, but not as evident as the editorial achievements, was the financing of a self-supporting newspaper. A large business staff accomplished this through subscriptions, advertising, and outside activities, such as sponsoring the annual variety show and selling Turkey Day mums and graduation name cards.

Faces—expressions, events—impressions; all the experiences of high school are recorded, never to be forgotten, in the *Cauldron*. The layouts and pictures have changed to capture a senior year in the manner of 1964. The newness cost money, and the *Cauldron* staff solicited patrons. LANGUAGE CLUBS

Language courses at Liberty High School require not only a knowledge of the syntax of the language, but also an understanding of the people who speak it.

Five language clubs supplement the curriculum by offering insight into the culture and heritage of foreign peoples and their lands. Spanish, German, Russian, French, and even Latin club programs are conducted in the native languages. Speakers, film strips, and newsreels provide information about the country and its people.

Holidays and festivals present opportunities for members to discover the traditions and participate in the customs of the countries. The stirring carols of all tongues, the lights of the German Advent wreath, and the gay ceremony of the Spanish piñata reveal the unity of all men in the Christmas spirit.

American students, performing the Russian folk dances, establish a bond between dancers in both countries. Latin students, enacting scenes from classical plays, discover the character and thought of another time. The French Club studies the philosophies of great Frenchmen and their influence on the world today.

At every club meeting, the members learn more about another people and, in so doing, discover more about themselves.










ART GALLERY CLUB




Taking advantage of well-timed blocks, Bernie Miller gains yardage with an end sweep.





COACH HARKINS ENDS CAREER WITH VICTORIOUS SEASON










Bill Taylor builds up endurance in a practice session.










