

Mr. and Mrs. William Ryan, Bethlehem R. D. 1, formerly of Fountain Hill, received good news from their two sons in the form of a letter and telephone call.

Staff Sergeant George F. Ryan, recuperating in an England Hospital from shrapnel wounds received in Germany September 15, told his parents of his increasing good health, and that he might soon be expected home. Inducted April 21 1941, he was sent overseas to England and on to France and Belgium. S-Sgt. Ryan has been awarded the Purple Heart.

Chief Yeoman James A. Ryan, in the Pacific over a year, called his parents upon his arrival at a California port. It was the first word the parents had heard from him for some time. Yeoman Ryan enlisted in 1935 and since then served four years in Hawaii. In one of his letters home, he asked his steel working dad to keep up the
