James Heil Crash Victim In England

At noon today Mrs. James Albert Heil of 305 Crest Avenue, received a War Department telegram informing her that her husband, Technical Sergeant James Albert Heil, was killed July 19 in Duxford, England, in an airplane accident. The wire stated that a letter containing details would follow.

Tech. Sgt. Heil, a graduate of Liberty High School, class of '41, celebrated his 20th birthday anniversary May 28. He was employed in the physics laboratory of the Bethlehem Steel Company, at the time of his induction in February, 1942. After completing training as a radioman in the Army Air Corps at Scott Field, Ill., and Miami, Florida, Tech. Sgt. Heil shipped overseas and has been stationed in England since February of this year.

In addition to his wife, the former Marie Clay, the young man is survived by his son, James Junior, aged 18 months; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Heil, 208 Crest Avenue; three brothers, Robert Heil, Signalman, 1-c., in the U. S. Navy, stationed in England; Pvt. Henry Ernest Heil, aged 18, stationed at Camp Sibert, Ala.; Richard, aged 16, a student at Liberty High School, and two sisters, Mrs. LaRue Bodder, of Springtown, and Elaine, aged 12 years, at home.
