This information was embodied in a letter recently received by his parents. The letter was dated January 1.

Acording to the 22-year old infantryman, he was struck by shrapnel from an exploding bomb while he crouched in a fox hole.

He was inducted into the armed forces April 17 of last year, and on September 1 was sent into the African theatre, being assigned to the Fifth Army. He received his basic training at Camp Joseph Robinson, Arkansas.

Before his induction he was employed at the Pettinos graphite mill.
