Pfc. Furry, Danielsville, Dies In Action

Pfc. Clarence L. Furry died in action in Belgium on January 15, acording to a telegram received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Casmus E. Furry, Danielsville, R. D. 1, on Saturday.

The 21-year-old infantryman had previously been listed missing in action the same day. He enlisted in the Army February 6, 1943 and received training at Camp Howze, Tex. and Louisiana before going overseas in March, 1944.

Private Tiret Class Furry received the Infantry Combat badge while participating in numerous battles in France. Later he was wounded and hospitalized in England and was awarded the Purple Heart. Following his return to active duty in France, he received the Bronze Star ribbon.

He attended Palmerton High school and prior to his induction was employed by the Bethlehem Steel Co.
