He attended Bethlehem High School and was employed as a machine operator for the Bethlehem Steel Company before entering the Army in July 1942. After the rigors of basic training at Keesler Field, Miss., he volunteered to become an aerial engineer-gunner and was sent to Harlington, Tex., for gunnery training. After graduating and receiving his wings, he was sent to Tonapah, Nev., for mechanic's training and became an engineer.

He was assigned to a regular crew and underwent the training phases in the states before being sent overseas last August. Since that time he has flown with his 15th AAF B-24 outfit on missions against German military targets in France, Germany, Poland and other countries of occupied Europe.
