## Ex-Marine Given Five Navy Awards

Richard J. Angerman, former Marine sergeant and veteran of many Pacific engagements, was the recipient of five Navy awards at ceremonies held recently at Philadelphia Navy base.

Ex-Sergeant Angerman was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for extraordinary achievement while participating in aerial fight against the enemy in the Phil-

ippine Islands area. In addition he received the Air Medal and gold stars in lieu of the second, third and fourth Air Medals "for meritorious action while participating in flights over enemy territory" during the first six months of 1945.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Angerman, 933 East Fifth St., he is a graduate of Bethlehem High School. During his 12 months tour of duty overseas, Angerman served in the Bismarck Archipelago and Philippine areas and in the fighting at Rabaul and Mindanao. He wears the Asiatic-Pacific Theatre ribbons, Philippine Liberation ribbon, American Theatre and World War II Victory ribbons. He expects to enter Philadelphia Museum, School of Industrial Arts, this Fall.
