Two Bangor Men Missing; One Wounded

Word was received on Wednesday afternoon from the War Department that Cpl. Horace Male was missing in action in Luxembourg as of December 19, 1944. He had been assigned to a tank battalion.

Cpl. Male was inducted into the service on March 26, 1942, and received basic training at Fort Meade, Md., and Camp Cooke, Cal. He also trained at Camp Forrest, Tenn.; Camp McCoy, Wis., and Pine Camp, N. Y. He went overseas in February, 1944.

Mrs. Mildred Counterman, of Third Avenue and Eighth Street, Bangor, was informed by the War Department on Wednesday afternoon that her husband, Pvt. Harold Counterman, is missing in action in Belgium since December 22, 1944.

He was inducted into the service on March 14, 1944, received training at Camp Wheeler, Ga., and went overseas in August, 1944. He was a member of the infantry.

Mrs. Lucy Giardinere Finocchio, of North Seventh Street, Bangor, was informed by telegram yesterday afternoon by the War Department that her husband, Sgt. Joseph A. Finocchio, was wounded in action in Belgium on January 3, 1945.

He was inducted into the service February 18, 1944, and received basic training at Camp Wheeler, Ga. He was later assigned to an infantry unit at Fort Meade, Md., and went overseas in August, 1944.
