Three Local Navy Veterans Given Releases

Three Bethlehem veterans were discharged last week by the U. S. Naval Personnel Separation Center, Terminal Island, San Pedro, Calif., according to an announcement made today by Capt. Frank R. Walker, USN, their commanding officer.

William T. Cliff, PhOM2/C, USNR, 1308 Spring St., enlisted in the Navy April 27, 1944 at Allentown. He served at Camp Peary, Va.; the Naval Air Station at Pensacola, Fla.; Beaufort, S. C.; Camp Kearney, Calif., and the Naval Air Station at San Diego. An apprentice at Bethlehem Steel Company when he entered service, he is undecided at present as to what his civilian plans will be. Cliff is a graduate of Quakertown High School. His wife, Emeline, resides at the Spring St. address.

A veteran of the Luzon and Okinawa campaigns is Leroy F. Reiman, RdM3/C, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Reiman, 530 High St. He enlisted January 27, 1944, while employed as a clerk by Bethlehem Steel Company. While on sea duty from July 17, 1944 up to the end of the war, he served aboard the destroyer USS Gilligan and at bases in the Great Lakes, Point Loma, Calif. and Camp Catlin, Honolulu, T. H. Reiman is a graduate of Liberty High School and Penn State Extension. He plans to return to his former position at Bethlehem Steel Company.

Peter N. Lovric, GM3/C, is the son of Louise Lovric, 507 Sioux St. He enlisted in the Navy January 20, 1944, and after completing his boot training, was assigned to the USS Astoria, on which he served in the Pacific area from May 17,

1944, to March 1 of this year. Lovric wears the Philippine Liberation ribbon with one star; Asiatic Pacific Theatre ribbon with four battle stars, the American defense medal and the Victory medal. He is a graduate of Bethlehem Technical High School and a former Bethlehem Steel Company machinist. Lovric intends to go to school.
