

Nazareth Soldier Teaching Chinese How To Fight

Sergeant Victor S. Weiss, 29, of Nazareth, is on duty as an artillery maintenance man with a Field Artillery Training Center of the Y-Force Operations Staff, the world's largest military mission.

This Field Artillery Training Center is one of several such training centers operated by Y-Force under the leadership of Brigadier General Frank Dorn, for the purpose of improving the combat efficiency of the Chinese Expeditionary Force by training them in the use of modern weapons furnished by the United States and in modern battle tactics.

Sgt. Weiss has been instrumental in teaching the Chinese soldiers how to give the proper care to their artillery pieces. He has found time since he has been in China to follow his favorite sports of football, baseball, and basketball, playing on a number of local teams. Sports have probably done more to make the lonely GI's in China feel at home than any other one thing, and Vic-

tor has been right there all the time.

Weiss graduated from Nazareth High School in 1934 and from Moravian College in 1939. He was active in college sports and played professional baseball after his graduation. He was working for the Bethlehem Steel Company before joining the Army in June, 1942.
