Former Steel Inspector Dead In Battle

Corporal Willard W. Madouse, who had resided with his aunt, Mrs. Laura Schoneberger, Easton R. D. 3, was killed in action April 5, somewhere in Germany. He was a son of the late Frank and Alice Madouse.

Cpl. Madouse attended Miller Heights schools and was employed as an army ordnance inspector by the Bethlehem Steel Company before entering the service November 6, 1942. He completed his basic training at Fort Knox and Camp Campbell, Ky., and at Camp Berkeley, Texas. He went overseas with an armored division last September, and after a few months stay in England, he was sent to France and Germany.

He was a member of St. John's Lutheran and Reformed Church, Farmersville. Surviving are two sisters, Matrona, Bethlehem; Marjorie, Bath R. D. 1, and four brothers, Maynard, at home; Weldon, somewhere in Germany with the airborne troops, Cleatus, Bowmanstown, and Curtis, Butztown.
