Major Galloway, now stationed at New York City, resided at 233 East Garrison Street. His promotion to the rank of major follows more than 15 years of service with the National Guard and more recently with the regular army.

Major Galloway left with Battery B for active army service on September 16, 1940, when National Guard units were called to active service. Since then he has been transferred, but it was not announced to what unit he is at present attached.

Major Galloway is a son of Mr. and Mrs. John Lee Galloway, Pittsburgh. His wife is the former Dorothy Hess, residing at 233 East Garrison Street. Prior to entering active armed services, Major Galloway was employed at the Bethlehem Steel Company.
