## Pfc. Kauffman Liberated From German Prison MAY 4 1945

In a joyous letter from Germany, Pfc. Kenneth M. Kauffman informed his mother, Mrs. Asher Kauffman, of Hellertown, R. D. 1, that he was liberated from a German prison camp by the English on April 16.

Pfc. Kauffman stated he is now awaiting shipment to England for treatment of shoulder and foot wounds and then expects to be sent home on furlough. The letter, dated April 19, tells with what happy thanksgiving the inmates of Camp B-11 received the English Army which freed them.

The young soldier, who was captured in the battle of Luxembourg, was reported missing and then a prisoner as of Dec. 20, 1944. He enlisted in the Army at the age of 18 on April 5, 1940, and served two and a half years in Panama as an MP. He then received training at Camp McCoy, Wisc., and went overseas with an infantry unit in October, 1944.
