## Local Men Take Service Oath At Allentown

Forty-two men were inducted from Bethlehem on Saturday by the U. S. Armed Forces Induction Station at Grant and Liberty Streets, Allentown. These included 23 who entered the Navy and 19 who joined the Army. Of the Army men 16 will be called to active service on February 19 and will leave for New Cumberland. Three, who are assigned to the Army Air Corps for aviation cadet training will await further orders.

The Navy inducted 12 from Schuylkill County, 11 from Norristown, one from Montgomery County and one from Bucks County.

Sixteen men from Norristown inducted into the Army Saturday also will leave on the 19th of February for the reception center. Schuylkill County supplied 18 men Saturday who also will be called to active duty at the same center on the same day.

Two Eastonians were inducted Saturday and will be called to active service on February 18th at New Cumberland.
