### **Corp. Traupman Visits Draft Board While On Furlough**

Bethlehem U. S. Selective Service Board No. 3, with headquarters in the Department of Public Assistance Building, Eighth Avenue, Bethlehem, yesterday received a visit from a man inducted into the Army by the board whom the board believes is an excellent example of what Army selection can do for an industrious man.

The soldier is Technical Corp. Joseph Traupman, 36, of 332 Water Street, Bethlehem, who is spending a 19-day furlough here with his sister, Mrs. Helen Elizabeth Favinger, 304 Vineyard Street, Bethlehem. Corp. Traupman, who was inducted last November 7 expects promotion to the rank of sergeant shortly.

The local man whom the board feels has really made good is stationed with the headquarters detachment of Service Unit No. 1814 at Fort Monticello, Ark. He dropped in at the board offices to show his corporal's stripes to his acquaintances.

In spite of his age, L. R. Drown, chief board clerk, reported today, the soldier has no intention of leaving the service and is anticipating active duty for the war's duration. He was employed as a night cashier in New Jersey by the Greyhound Bus Lines before his induction. Corp. Traupman feels that this work has helped him greatly in his Army duties.
