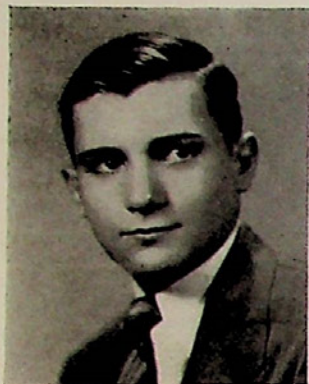


Senior Activities

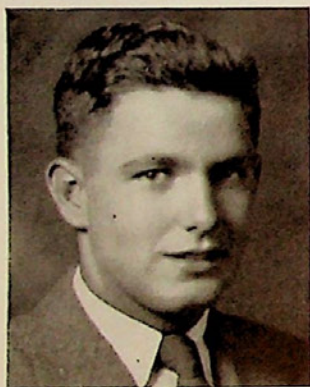

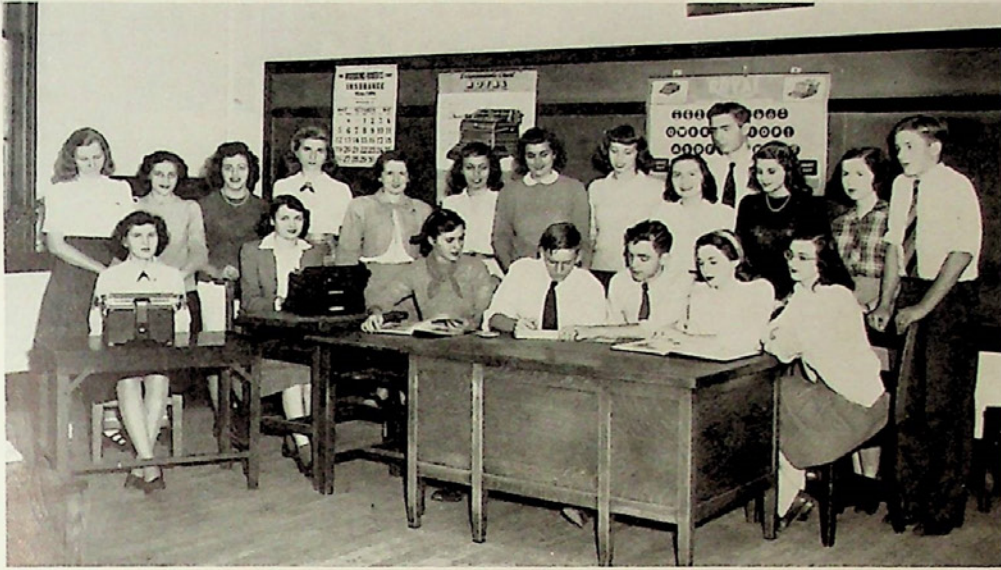

It was the duty of Anne Morgan and Dolores Ecker to compile the facts about the clubs.

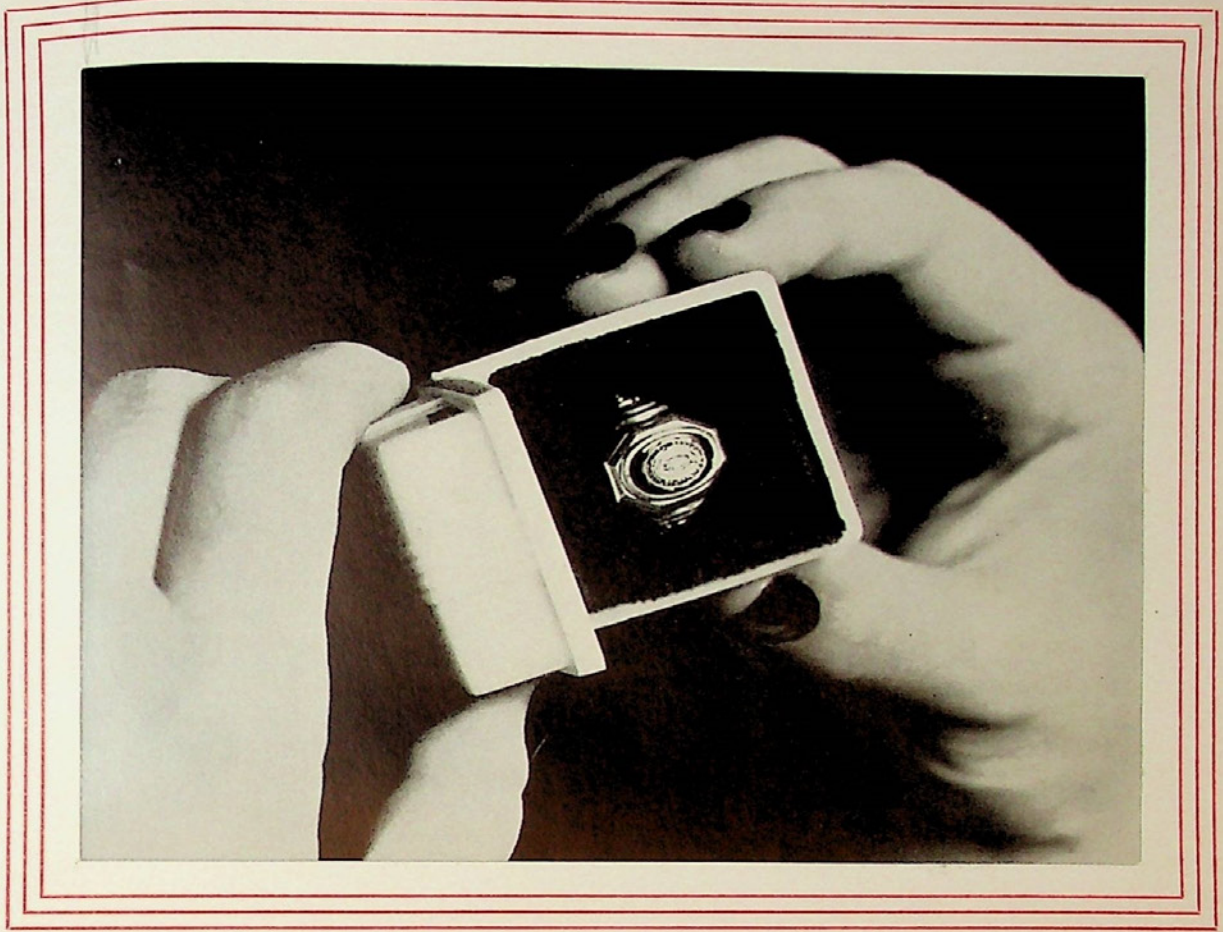
Patricia Foulkes was head of the feature department.

Richard Mohr arranged for the pictures of the clubs to be taken, while Lita Kirkwood snapped the candid shots.

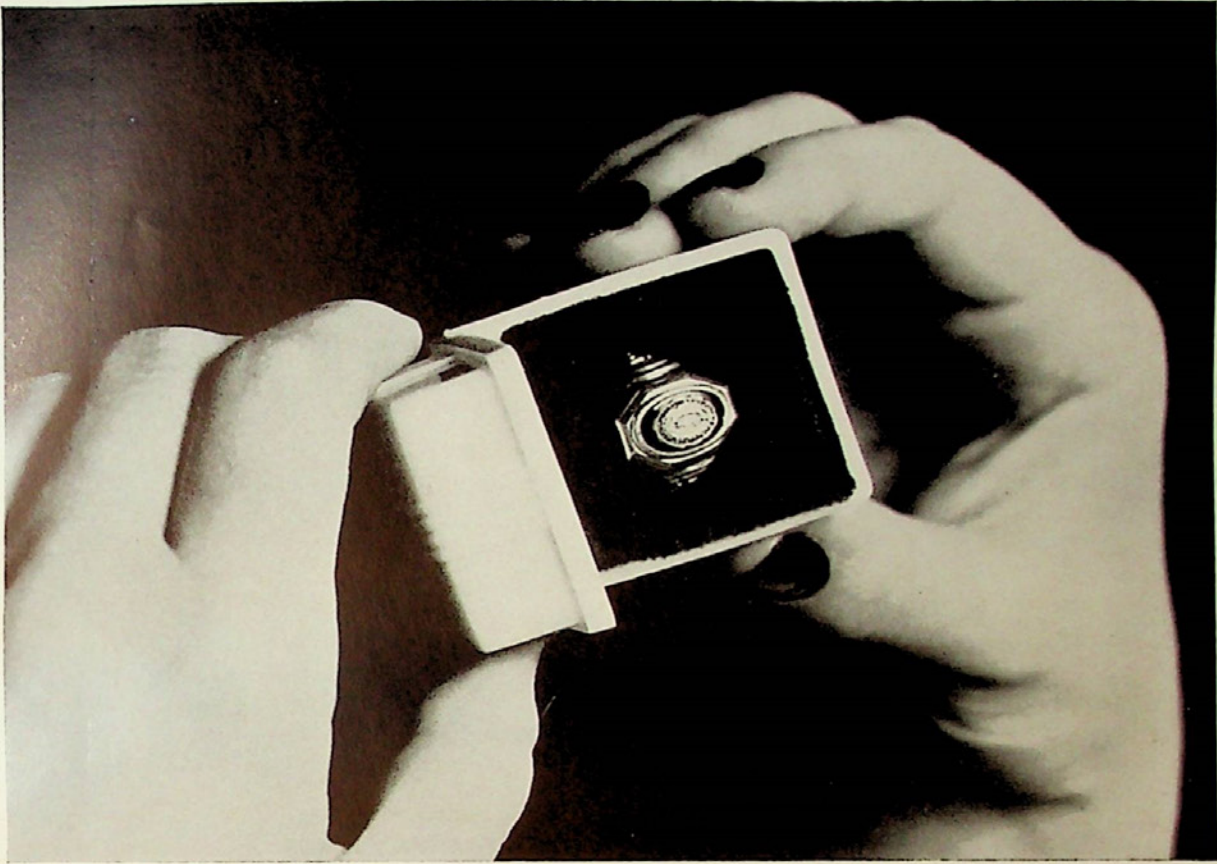

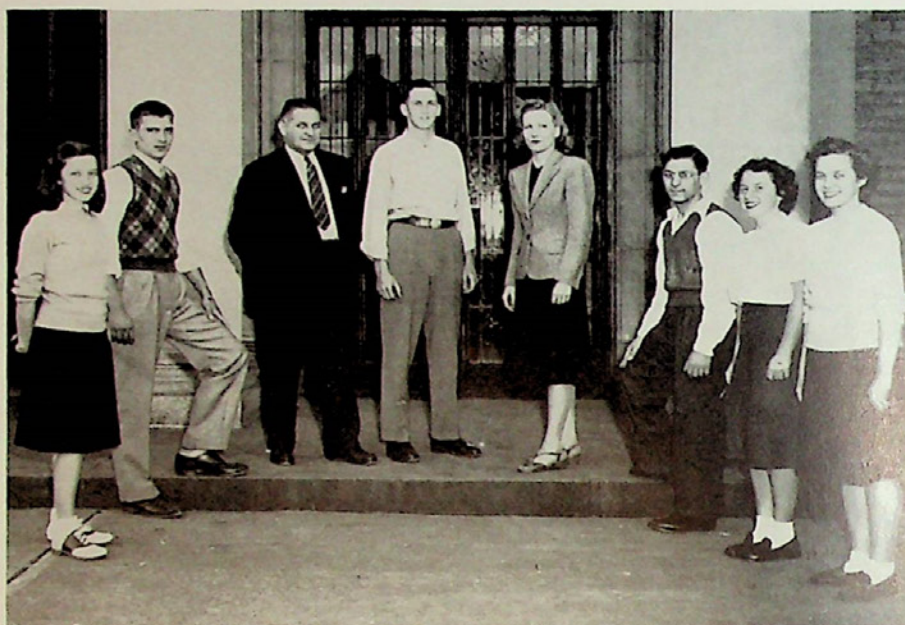


School Life

A picnic with lots of fun and plenty of eats brought the club year to a close.

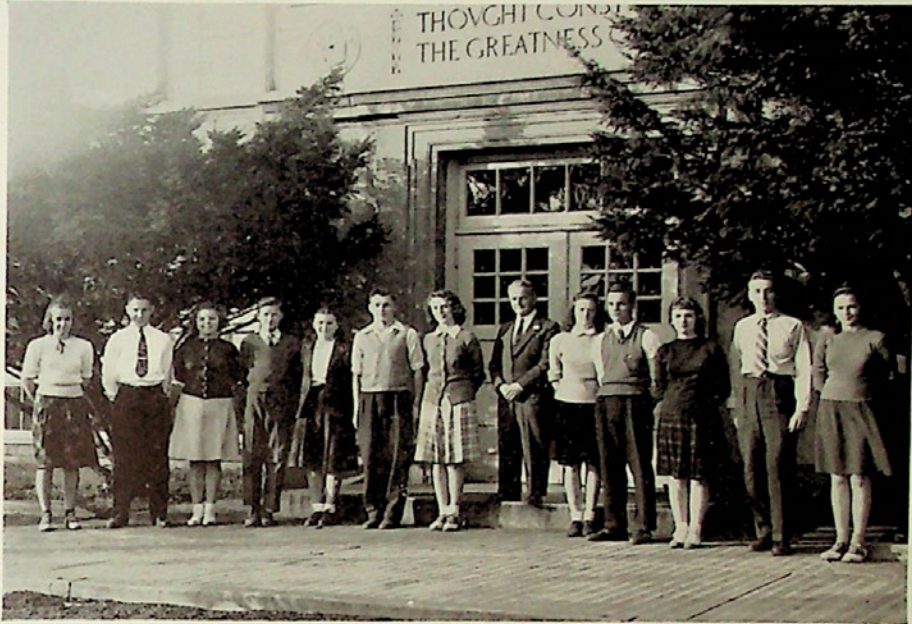

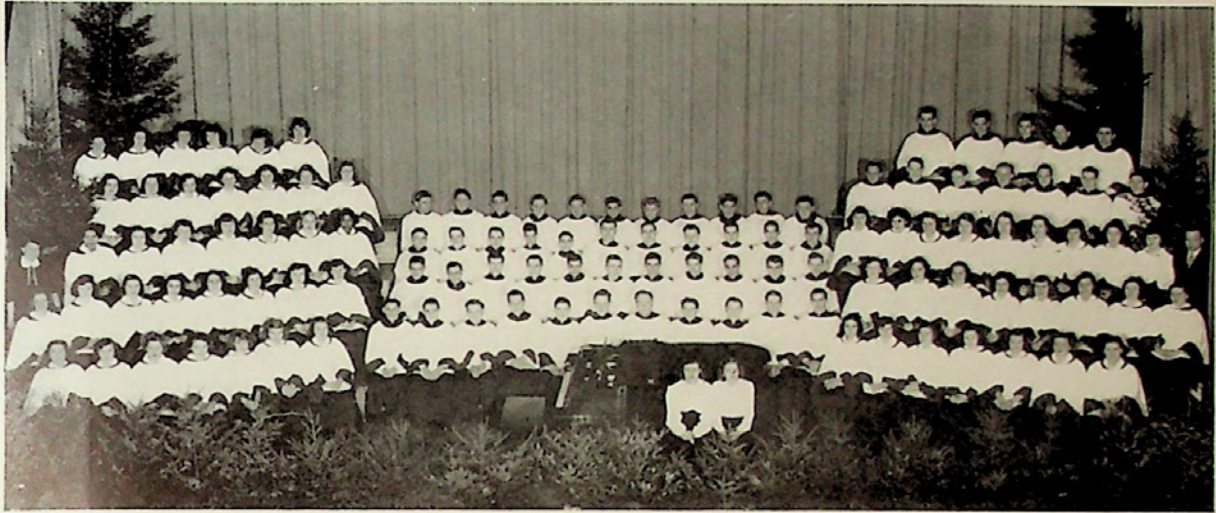

Selected from the glee club is the very popular group of singers, the Liberty Twelve Plus. This group provides much entertainment not only in the school, but throughout the city.

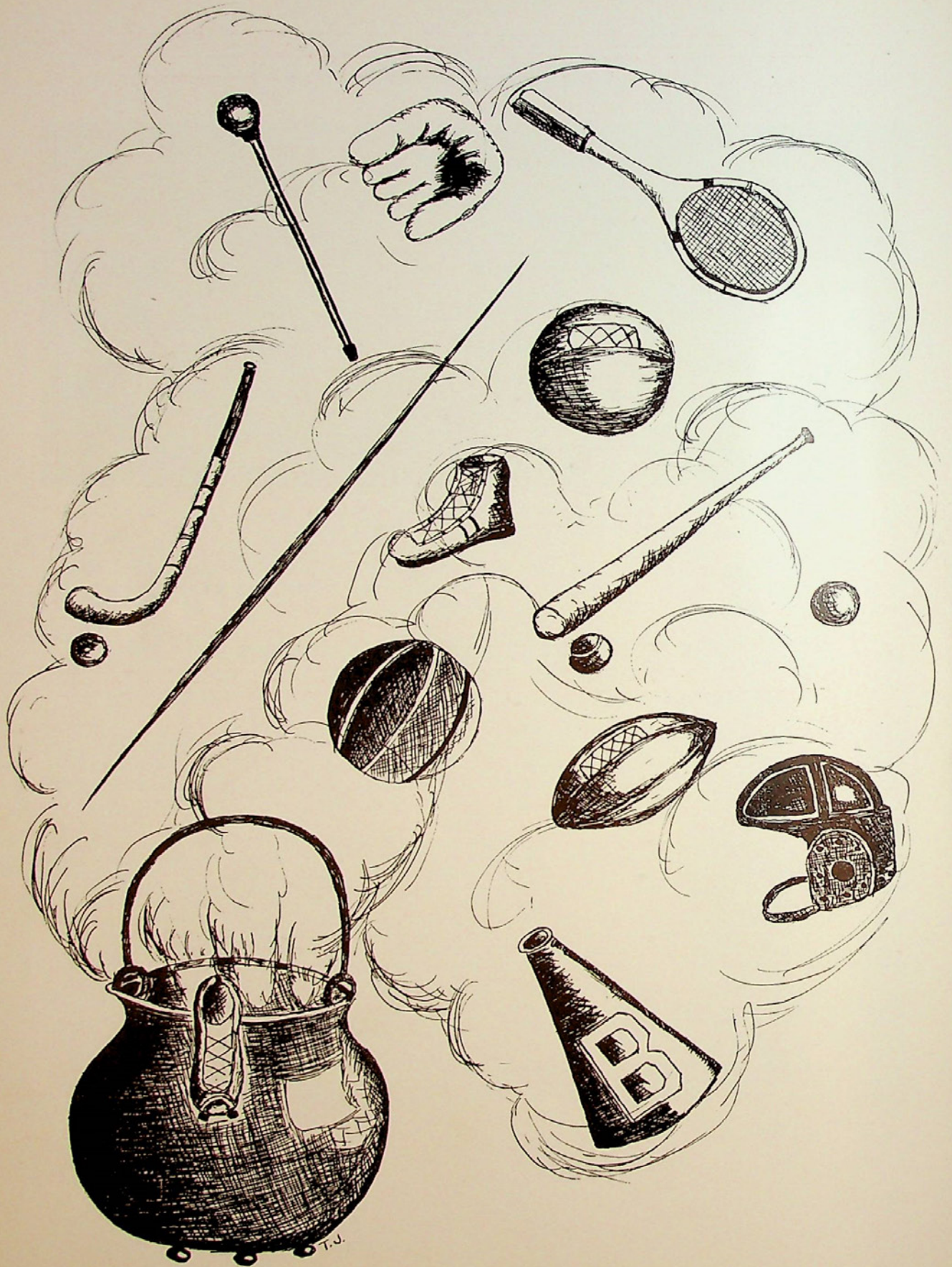

However, the wearers of the "B" are not the only participants in Liberty High sports, for the vast majority assume the role of spectator.

TRIBUTE TO COACH WILLIAM G. STARK



William George Stark has been coach of wrestling, soccer, and swimming at Liberty High School since 1922. "Bill," as he is known to his friends, and they are a myriad, has won State wide recognition for the excellence of his athletic teams. His record is an enviable one. Born in Glasgow, Scotland, he was educated in the Gorbals Public Schools and gained the highest award, "The Merit Certificate," with the "City of Glasgow Coat of Arms" on it.

He is a graduate of Liberty High School, 1916. The cheerful, canny Caledonian has managed to keep this fact more or less a secret for all these years. East Stroudsburg State Teachers College also is proud to point to him as one of her sons.

When the teaching staff of Liberty High School was chosen, the Directors of the School Board gave much thought to the Department of Physical Education. Athletics and Physical Education were placed on a sound modern footing. The Physical Education Staff finally selected consisted of Austin A. Tate, William G. Stark, and Miss Christine Wellington. Mr. Stark was named instructor of Boys' and Girls' Swimming with the sanction of Mr. E. H. Nelson, Supervisor of Physical Education of the Bethlehem Public Schools. At this time "Bill" launched his brilliant coaching career as coach of wrestling, soccer, and swimming. He organized the Junior High School and Grade School Soccer Leagues. The Liberty High School Junior Team won the championship nine years straight, annexing three handsome silver trophies. The Liberty High School Varsity Soccer Team met with signal success, campaigning undefeated, season after season, against "Top-Notch" teams in New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania. In the present season of 1947, they again added one more undefeated season to their remarkable record, making it seventeen undefeated seasons in twenty-five years of Bethlehem High School soccer.

"Bill" had the honor of producing the first high school wrestling team in Pennsylvania. His wrestling teams were recognized as the strongest in the East. Four times they concluded strenuous campaigns unconquered.

In 1924 his team won the A. A. U. Lehigh Valley Team Championship and the "Weinland Cup."

Liberty High wrestlers captured the Eastern States Interscholastic Wrestling Championship at Franklin and Marshall College in 1926 and again in 1927, and the Eastern States Championship at Liberty High Gymnasium in 1931.

In 1940 Bethlehem won two state titles and one runner-up finalist, and the Mythical Team Championship when William Unangst was crowned 154 pounds champion, Peter Cicchine the 126 pounds champion, and Robert Morgan runner-up in the 185 pounds championship at the P.I.A.A. wrestling championships at Penn State College. In 1947, Charlie Cope was crowned P.I.A.A. 154 pounds champion in the state finals at Kingston, Pa.

"Bill," in his youth, was a versatile athlete—a champion wrestler and swimmer; he holds prizes for gymnastics, and he has distinguished himself as an amateur boxer. He possesses the rare ability of imparting his knowledge of these sports in a highly successful manner to his pupils.

He is, moreover, an active Red Cross worker, and he was honored with the chairmanship of Life Saving and First Aid of the local chapter from 1924 to 1937. He was also special examiner for this district for ten years for Life Saving, and at present he is a member of our local Disaster Emergency Squad. He has been swimming director of the Bethlehem Y.M.C.A. for the past four years, and in 1946 was honored with the presidency of the Leaders Council.

Still healthy and active in body and keen in mind, "Bill" has reached the retirement age prescribed by our School Board. We regret that he is leaving an institution where he was an asset and a gentleman.

It is with a touch of loneliness that we come to the parting of the ways. But his spiritual influence will remain with us, to gild the past with sweet and virile memories and brighter days to come.

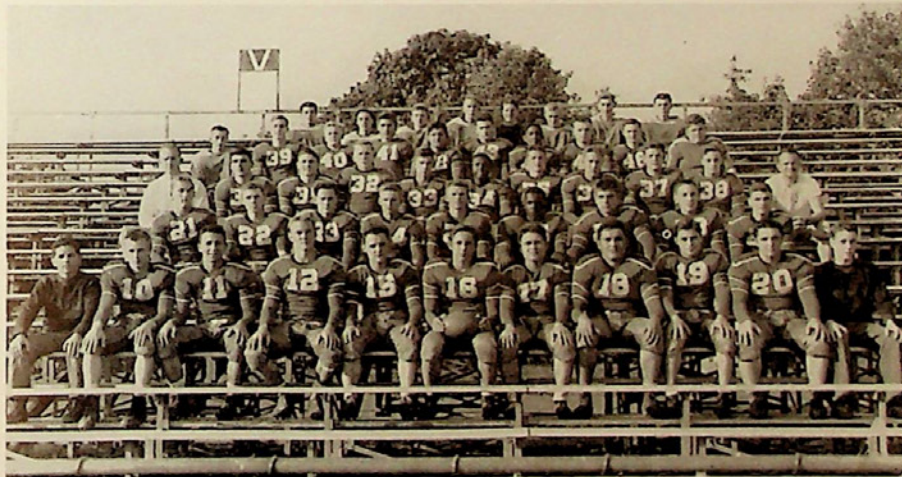

Our big project during this year was Booth Tarkington's *Seventeen* which was given on November 16 and 17 by members of our Junior class. In addition to being very enjoyable, it proved to be a lucrative undertaking.

April 12, 1947 was the date of the Junior class dance given in order to raise funds for graduation and other expenses.

Two important elections occurred in the last semester; namely, an election for class officers and a *Cauldron* staff. We

reelected the same class officers, and Thomas Mohr was selected as Editor-in-Chief of the *Cauldron*.

Election of Student Council officers took place early in the school year. The results were Philip Erdle, President; Solomon Goldberg, Vice-President; Betty Fenstermacher, Secretary; Doris Rohland, Treasurer; and Social Activities Secretary, Carolyn Knies.

Pep dances, given by our class before almost every football game, were very well attended by members of every class.

A thrilling mystery, *Double Door*, by Elizabeth McFadden was given on November 14 and 15, 1947, under the direction of Mr. Truman J. Reese.

The *Cauldron* staff worked hard collecting pictures, writing biographies, gathering snapshots, and meeting deadlines in order to produce the best possible yearbook.

Members of our Senior class presented a talent show in chapel. Until this assembly, little did we think that our class had such potentialities.

The combined graduation exercises of the Senior classes of Liberty High School and its Technical division were held Tuesday, June 15, 1948 in Grace Hall on the Lehigh University campus.

The history of our class will not end with graduation, but it will continue in a greater sense as we take our places as citizens of a larger world.

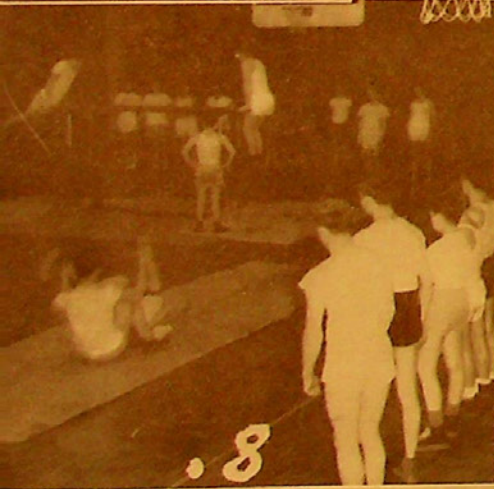

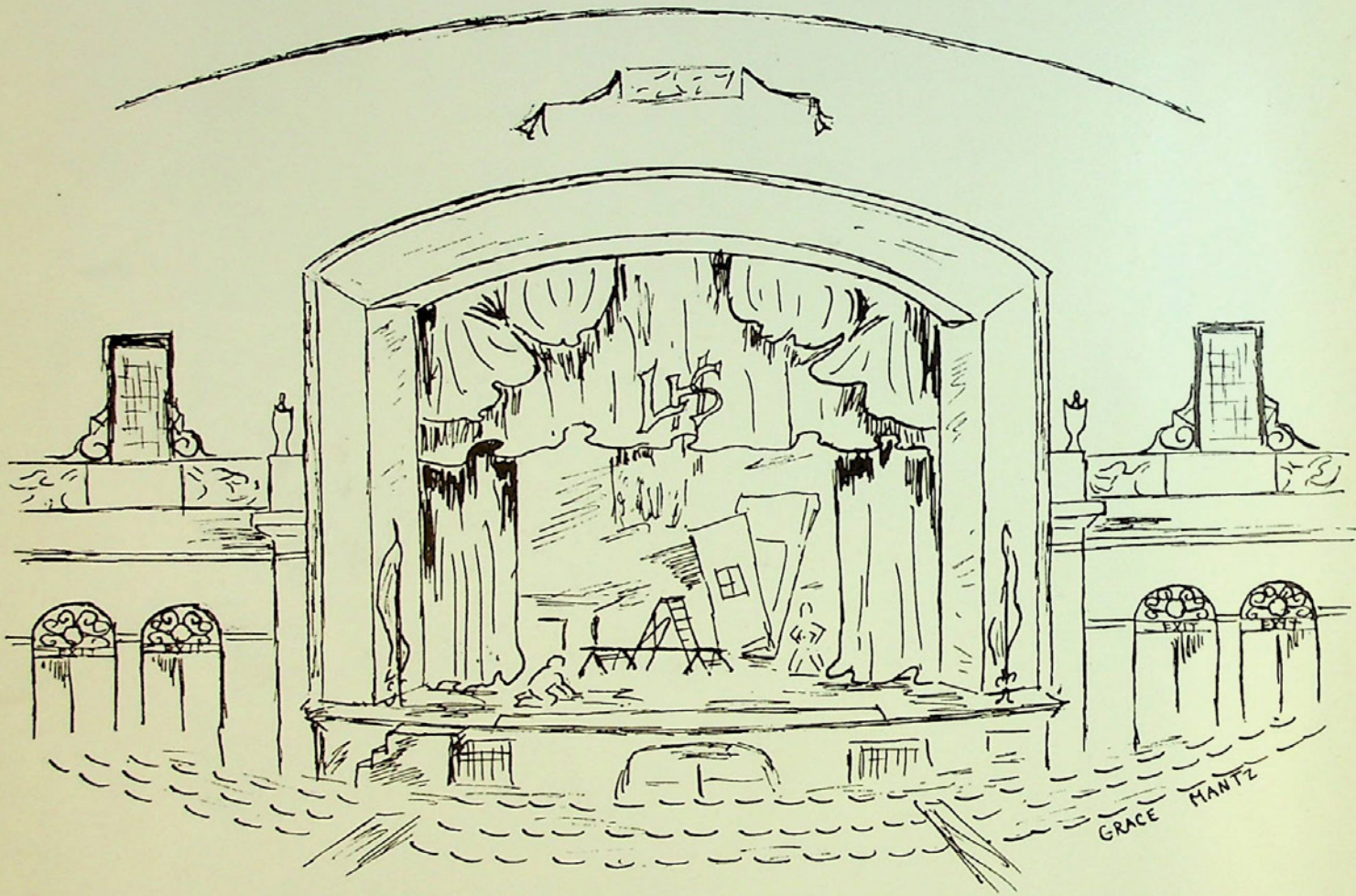
