**CORPORAL G. E. FRACE,
BATH, KILLED IN ACTION**

**Mrs. Meda Frace, Mother, Re-
ceives Telegram From
Army Adjutant.**

Mrs. Meda Frace, Bath, R. D., received word Saturday afternoon that her son, Corporal George E. Frace, 23, was killed in action in the South Pacific January 20.

The brief telegram received by Mrs. Frace notifying her of her son's death expressed the deepest regret and added that complete details would follow. The telegram was signed by Adjutant General Ulio, of the U. S. Army.

Corporal Frace's death is Bath's first war casualty.

He was educated in Monocacy School on the Irish Settlement outside of Bath. Corporal Frace enlisted in the U. S. Army March 1, two years ago. He was stationed at Pearl Harbor at the time of the Jap attack on the island.

Corporal Frace, in the two years he served with the U. S. Army, had never received a furlough due to the great distance he was stationed from his home in Bath.

He is survived by his mother, one sister, Margaret, and one brother.
