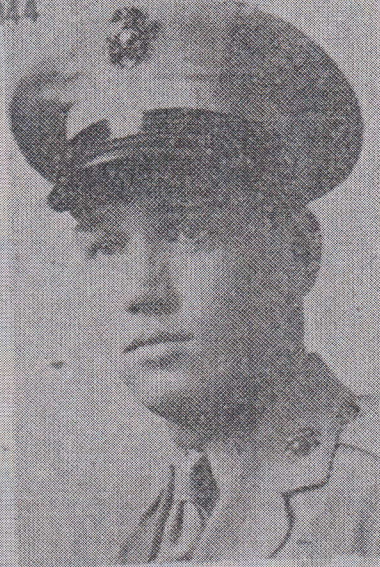

Andrew L. Slafkosky, Chaplain U. S. N. R., and his brother, Leonard Slafkosky, were recently commissioned lieutenants in their respective branches of the service.

Lt. Andrew Slafkosky attended SS. Cyril and Methodius Parochial School. He entered St. Charles Seminary, Overbrook, Pa., where he studied for the priesthood and was ordained in 1939. Continuing his studies, he attended the graduate school of the Catholic University, Washington, D. C., where he received the Doctorate in Canon Law in 1941. Slafkosky was then assigned to the teaching faculty at Allentown Central Catholic High School, where he taught



Latin and Religion and coached the football and baseball teams as well. Lt. Slafkosky is stationed at the U. S. Naval Air Station, Jacksonville, Fla.

His brother, A. Leonard Slafkosky, is a graduate of SS Cyril and Methodius Parochial school, Bethlehem High School and St John's College of Annapolis, Md.

In the Marine Reserves since June, 1943, he finished his boot training at Farris Island, and entered the Officers' Candidate School at Quantico, where he was commissioned.

Upon completion of three more months of training he was assigned to the Radar School at Harvard University, followed by training at the Communications School at Quantico.
