## Sgt. William Balchus At Rest Camp After Release From Prison

ate.

Heart, Bronze Star, three Oak Leaf
Clusters and holds the Presidential
Citation. He enlisted in the U.S.
Army six years ago and was serving in the Philippines with the Infantry at the time of the Jap sneak
attack.

word from him in a two-year period,
late in October, 1943, when he was
reported a prisoner of the Japanese
