Walnutport R. I Man Wounded, Gets Purple Heart

Walter Miltenberger, Jr., son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter W. Miltenberger, of Walnutport Route 1, has been wounded in action according to a letter received by his parents through the channels of the American Red Cross. The injury was caused by shell fragments which wounded his shoulder and other portions of the left side of his body.

In a letter to his parents he said that he would be in the hospital

for six or seven weeks and would then be able to get back at 'em again. He had the highest praise for the care which he is receiving while in the hospital.

The purple heart, which he has been awarded, was received by his parents yesterday in acknowledgement of his service and the injuries he has received.

Pfc. Miltenberger, who is a member of an infantry division, has been in the service 8 months, and in the North African theater of war for the past two months.

Before his induction into the Army he was employed by the firm of Brown and Borhek.

A brother, Sherwood Miltenberger, is a member of a signal photo outfit and is serving somewhere overseas. He left this country about four weeks ago, his destination not as yet known.
