Inexperienced talent and the loss of several veterans to the armed forces were two important factors which had Coach Butler singing the "blues" as he prepared for the 1943 football campaign, Facing the popular coach and his aides was a typical Bethlehem High School schedule, gruelling from start to finish with no breathers.

In their first contest, the green Hurricane eleven gave a brilliant account of themselves before bowing to Shenandoah 7-6. The next Saturday saw the Liberty boys pour it on and take the measure of Scranton Tech 33-0. Invading John Harris for their first conference clash, the Hurricane saw victory vanish in the waning moments of play as the Harrisburg combine took a close 19-13 decision. Our boys ran roughshod over Pottsville in the next game. A diminutive sophomore scat-back, Bill Wash, paced the Hurricane in a 39-6 rout. After tripping Reading 6-0, the Hurricane dropped a hard fought and a bitterly contested game to Easton's Red Rovers 16-7. Playing their best football of the season, our boys thoroughly outplayed an undefeated Phillipsburg eleven, but they had to be content with a 7-7 stalemate. After thrashing Hazleton 21-0 the Liberty Boys were rudely upset by a scrappy Shamokin team. The traditional Turkey Day game with Allentown was played before what was probably the biggest crowd in Bethlehem gridiron history. The Hurricane battled every inch of the way; and it put up a great fight; but Allentown's Canaries, later crowned Conference Champs, gained a 13-0 decision.

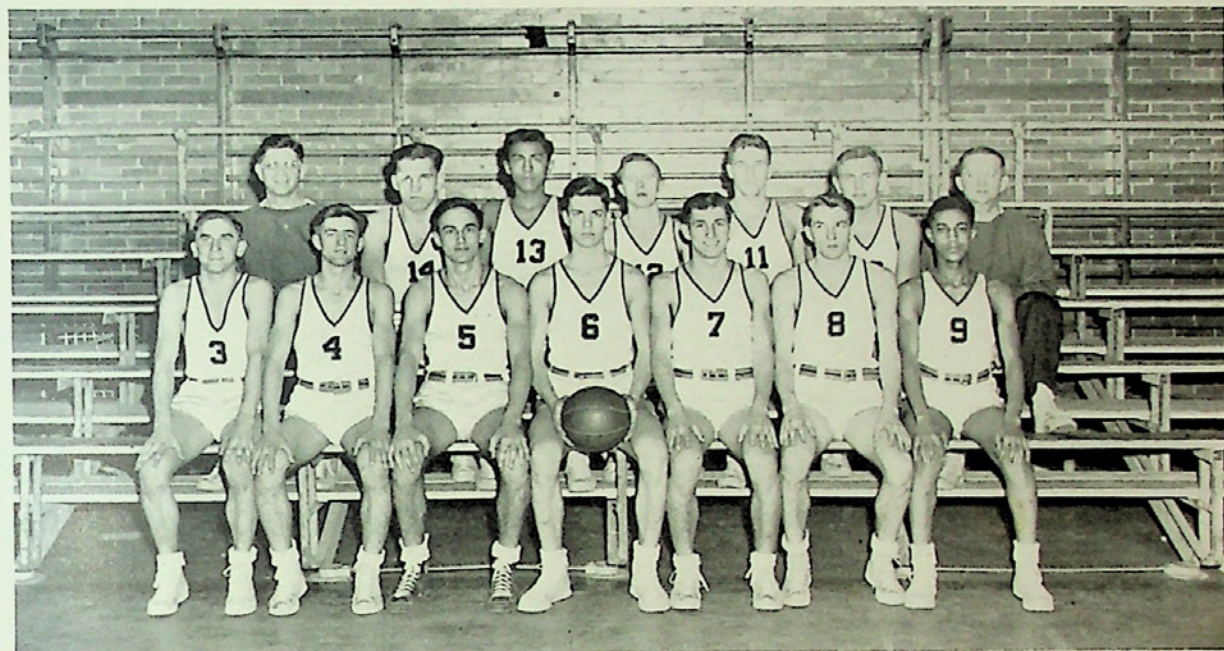
The 1943-44 team can boast of an exceptionally good season in which the team was undefeated and tied only once.

However, defeats at the hands of Easton and Hazleton cost the Hurricane the second half crown.
