Navy Reports Judge's Son Among Missing

Lieut. Edward S. McCluskey, U. S. Navy, son of President Judge and Mrs. Frank P. McCluskey, of Easton, is reported missing in action.

Judge McCluskey got a telegram from the personnel bureau of the Navy department today, informing him that his son has been officially listed among naval casualties.

"Other than the telegram we have heard nothing. It would not be quite right to say where we last heard from Edward," Judge McCluskey said this morning.

Lieut. McCluskey, 32, held a commission in the Naval Reserves when he entered active service in February, 1942. Only recently another Eastonian with a naval commission, home on furlough, told of renewing acquaintances with Lieut. McCluskey in the Mediterranean theater.

Prior to his entering the service of his country, Lieut. McCluskey was a member of the Northampton County bar and at the time of his induction was serving Easton as its city solicitor.

Native of Easton and graduate of its public school system, Lieut. McCluskey went to Lafayette College and after getting his degree took up his law studies at the University of Pennsylvania. He was admitted to the Northampton County bar November 4, 1935.

Lieut. McCluskey has two brothers, Frank McCluskey Jr., and Donald McCluskey, in the armed forces. Frank, a Marine, has seen service in the Solomons. Donald is in the Army and is stationed at the induction center at New Cumberland, Pa.
