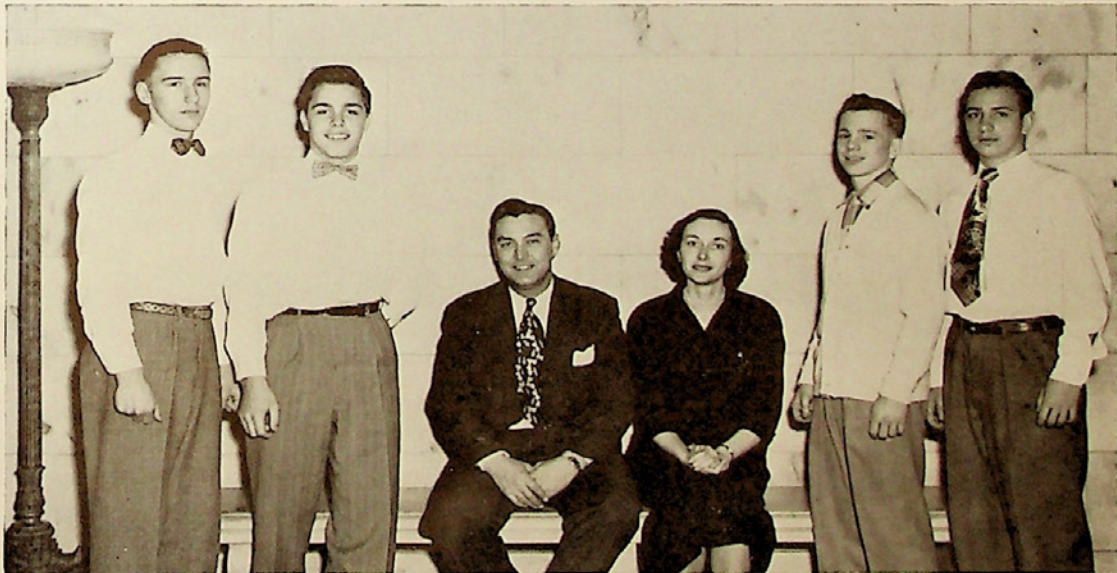

The third year "Le Cercle Francais" also heard reports and had a Christmas Party. Each meeting was made more enjoyable by songs and games in French.

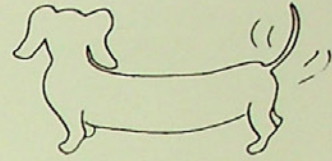

On other occasions during the year various programs were planned by the members. These included games, puzzles, reports, songs, and plays.

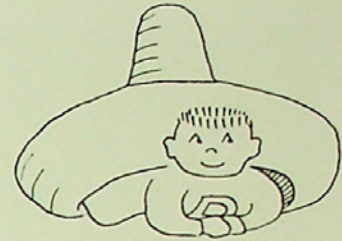

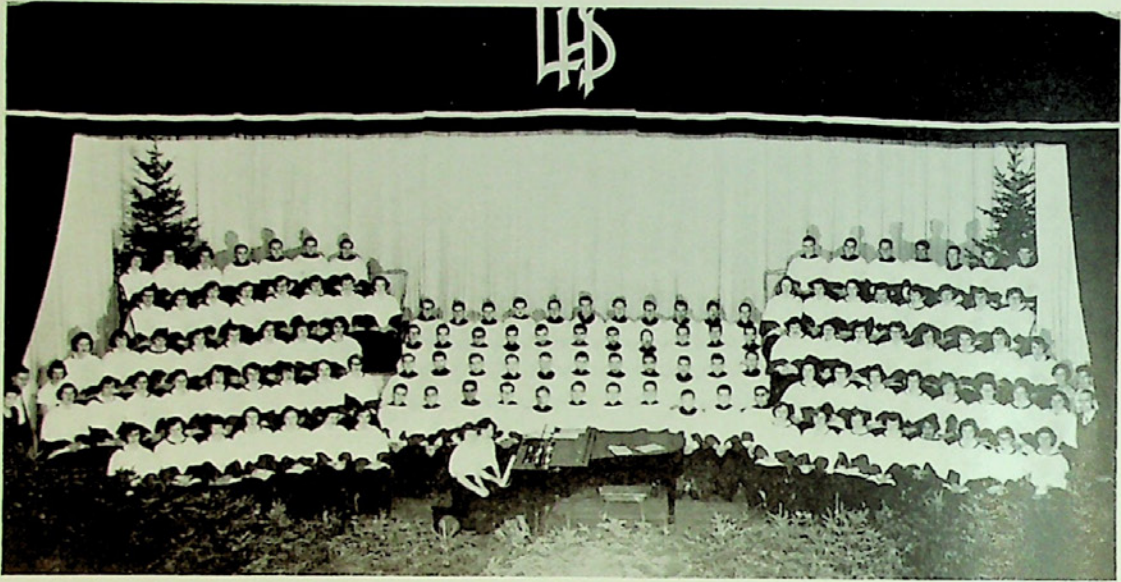
This organization provided worthwhile entertainment for many local service clubs and church groups.

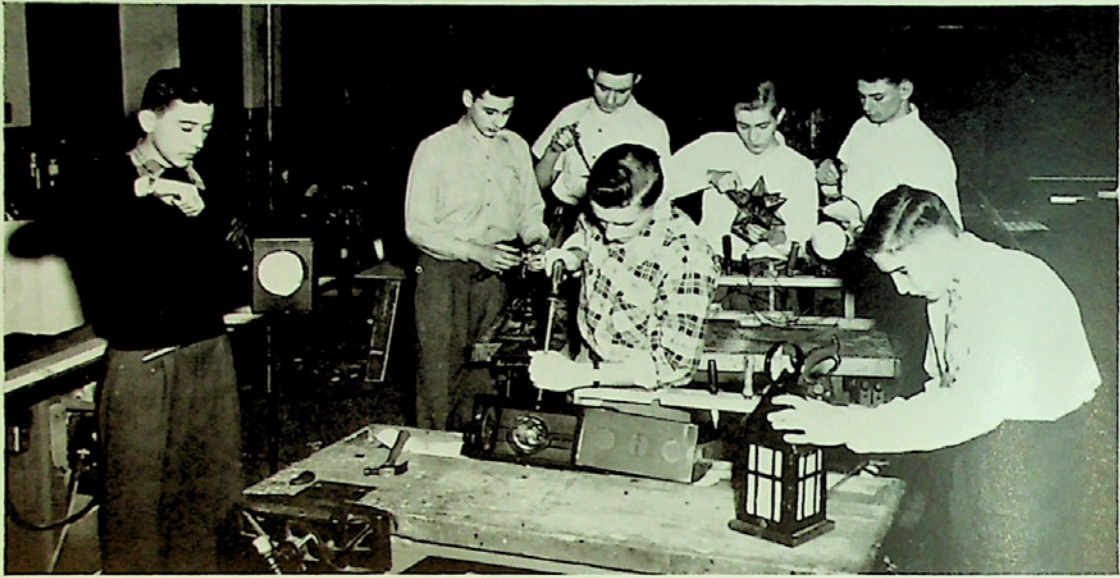

DRAFTING SHOP



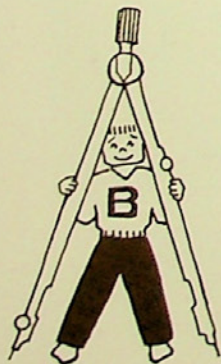
Drafting today in our industrial world is becoming a vital necessity. Practically every piece of structure and every sort of mechanical apparatus must first be put down on a drawing sheet. Drawing is an art which was developed by primitive man, and was handed down by the more learned ancient scholars.

In the Vocational Department of Bethlehem High School, there are three drafting shops which are under the direction of Mr. Alexander, Mr. Andrucci, and Mr. Dubbeling. There are various types of drafting taught in these shops; such as geometric figure, architectural drawing, and structural drawing.

The freshmen are under the guidance of Mr. Alexander. The fundamental steps of the trade are taught in this shop; such as various figures and designs. The development of orthographic and isometric projections are stressed next. For their sophomore requirements, they have to go deeper into the study of machine designing, and also attain a knowledge of the various gears. Some structural drawing is taught here but not enough to acquire a thorough knowledge of this field. This is done in preparation for the junior year.

A junior is then taught structural drawing. This refers to the detailing of beams and columns. When detailing, angles, clearances, dimensions, as well as beams and columns are dealt with. This is the course that is stressed thoroughly for a boy to get a well-rounded knowledge. Also in the junior year, architectural drawing is again taught; so that one may clear up any doubts that are left from the previous year. All seniors have structural drawing throughout the entire year. Here he is given a broad knowledge of this trade, so when he graduates he may go and secure for himself a good job.

When a boy leaves the drafting rooms of our vocational school, he may be sure to seek employment with a sense of confidence, because he knows he has an education that is worth while.



MACHINE SHOP

There is without a doubt an ever increasing trend toward the machinist trade. This fact is borne out by a look at the enrollment of the machine shop. Tech has two machine shops which can accommodate more than fifty students. Most of the boys in these shops are prompted by the urge to use their hands. But have it understood that they must use their minds, as well as their hands, to make a good machinist.

One of the chief reasons for this trend toward machine shop is the Bethlehem Steel Company's demand for trained men. The machine shops of Bethlehem Technical High School are doing their best to help fill the ever-increasing demand for trained machinists.

The machine shops of the school are under the able direction of Mr. H. Ross and Mr. A. Hope. Both men are skilled machinists and have been around machine shops for a good many years.

Mr. Ross's Shop is equipped with light machinery such as lathes, drill presses, and grinders. It is in this shop that we do radial machining and grinding. Such radial machining as threading, taper turning, drilling, and reaming on a lathe and boring is all completed in this shop.

Large machining is done in Mr. Hope's shop. Such machines as shapers, milling machines, and boring mills are located in this shop.

Any graduate of Tech who has taken a sincere interest in his machine shop course will always have a secure job in a specialized field of work. Machine shop practices are being improved every year, and there is great opportunity for those who can qualify.



ELECTRICAL SHOP



In our world today electricity plays a very important part. In our homes we have telephones, electric ranges, electric water heaters, and many other electrical appliances.

In our industrial world electricity is very important. Without it our large factories would still be small plants in which all the work would be done by hand.

To learn all the facts and information we need to work at this trade, our shop course is divided into three years. In our sophomore year we learn the use of electrical tools and instruments. The principles of circuits, such as series, parallel, and fourway is also taught this year. In our junior year we study the theory of electricity and work on A.C. and D.C. motors.

In our third year, or when we are seniors, we round out our course with practical work. We "shoot trouble", make repairs, build panel boards, and wind A.C. and D.C. motors.

With our years of training and practical work behind us, we feel that we are prepared for a place in the electrical field of our modern world.

To our instructor, Mr. J. Risbon, we all extend our humble thanks for the instruction and guidance that gave us the knowledge we acquired.



WOOD SHOP

The wood shop at Tech High is a very spacious and a well kept shop. It is spacious in the sense that everything is put in its place to allow more working room for the students. Every student sees that the shop is kept in good order by doing his bit in cleaning up after the days work is done.

We are ably instructed by Mr. Donald L. Detwiler who teaches us the value of wood and its uses. Mr. Detwiler has taught in the wood shop for a considerable number of years and has done an excellent job in turning out boys suited for the cabinet-makers trade.



The machines in the wood shop are not the newest type but they are all kept in the best running condition. Some of the machines are as follows: circular saws, band saws, jointers, surfacer, lathes, sanders, and drill presses.

There is an assortment of woods for the use of the students. The wood supply is plentiful, but there are only a few varieties of wood. Some of them are pine, walnut, beech, cedar, and cherry.

The projects undertaken in the wood shop are jobs for the school district. Recently the boys made trophy cases for two schools in Bethlehem. Another project was done for the athletic department at Bethlehem High School.

Cabinet making and wood working are very important in these modern times. There is always a need for a craftsman in the wood working field.



AUTO SHOP



As the time goes on, there is an increasing number of motor vehicles on the road. This trend has created one of the fastest growing industries of the present day. Due to constant improvements, there is an ever-present and growing demand for engineers and maintenance men, as well as a satisfactory parts central system. This fast-moving industry poses many difficult problems, and the people to solve these problems must be trained and retrained.

Here in the Vocational Department Auto Shop, such training can be had. Such training can be had in any phase of Auto Mechanics. Such specialties as body and fender work, radiator work, and ignition work, are all taught in the most modern way possible.

New and advanced methods, as well as modern equipment, are used in teaching all phases of this course. In this way our students are prepared for the better repair shops of the local garages.

Along with their regular work, they are given visual education pertaining to the auto industry. This phase of the training has as its objective the teaching through the medium of pictures. The films are the next best thing to having on-the-job experience. They show the right performances as well as the proper maintenance of an automobile and are of great value to students learning the trade.

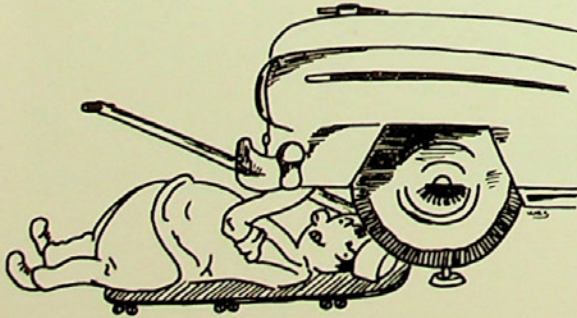
Much of the practical work is done on the cars of the students themselves. Many of the faculty have their cars repaired and washed. The students have a prescribed course and other work that they have to do on cars of their own.

The instructor of the auto shop is Joseph Vallone. Mr. Vallone is an experienced auto mechanic who has been associated with some of the leading automobile dealers and repair garages in this vicinity. The school can keep abreast of the latest methods of the auto industry by making use of the

current books and pamphlets that are constantly coming into the shop.

Close relations exist between the school and the automobile dealers in Bethlehem, and through these dealers, with several national manufacturers.

In addition to the knowledge about automobile mechanics, the students also get the basic principles of mechanics, thus giving this vocation a high transfer of training value.



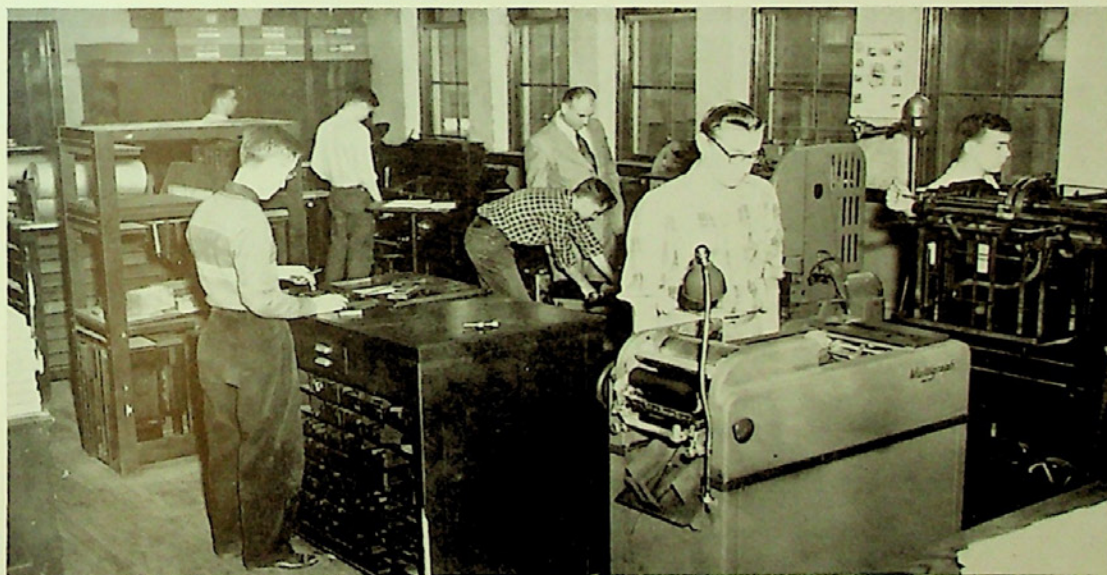
PRINTING SHOP

Printing is the art of assembling type systematically in order to reproduce on paper. Without printing the world would revert back to the middle ages. It is plain to see that if it were not for printing, industry would not be as advanced as it is today. That is why printing is known as the allied trade.

In our shops at Bethlehem Technical High School, we do a great deal of the printing for the Bethlehem Schools. Not only for high schools, but for grade schools and kindergartens as well.

In order to give you an idea of what we print in our shops, here are a few of our most important jobs. The jobs range from small tickets for plays, minstrels, basketball games, and dances, to large forms such as programs, booklets, and many others.

Our shop is well equipped for the large amount of printing we do each year. We have two automatic cylinder presses for our programs, booklets, etc. Three plate presses for printing tickets, report cards, envelope corners, etc. One multigraph for ruled forms. It has been said by groups of men who have visited various vocational schools throughout the country, that our shop has one of the best layouts of any they have seen. The overall shop consists of a composing room of over two hundred and fifty cases of type.



RADIO SHOP



Oh, they float through the air with the greatest of ease—that is the secret of radio. Radio waves do float through the air, in much the same way as light rays. Because of this fact, our modern communication system is possible. Yes, communication around the world is made possible by these invisible benefactors. All that is necessary is to harness them. The transmitter and receiver do this job for us, making it possible for us to listen to beautiful music, which originates at the other end of the continent.

Sometimes, however, these transmitters and receivers fail to operate properly and require repairs. That is the job of Mr. Hartman, Tech High's radio instructor. Mr. Hartman works with the boys, trying to teach them everything that he knows. This is only possible if the boys apply themselves to their studies and shop-work.

Good jobs in radio repairing are available to any boy who graduates from Tech, and has put his nose to the grindstone in Tech's radio shop.

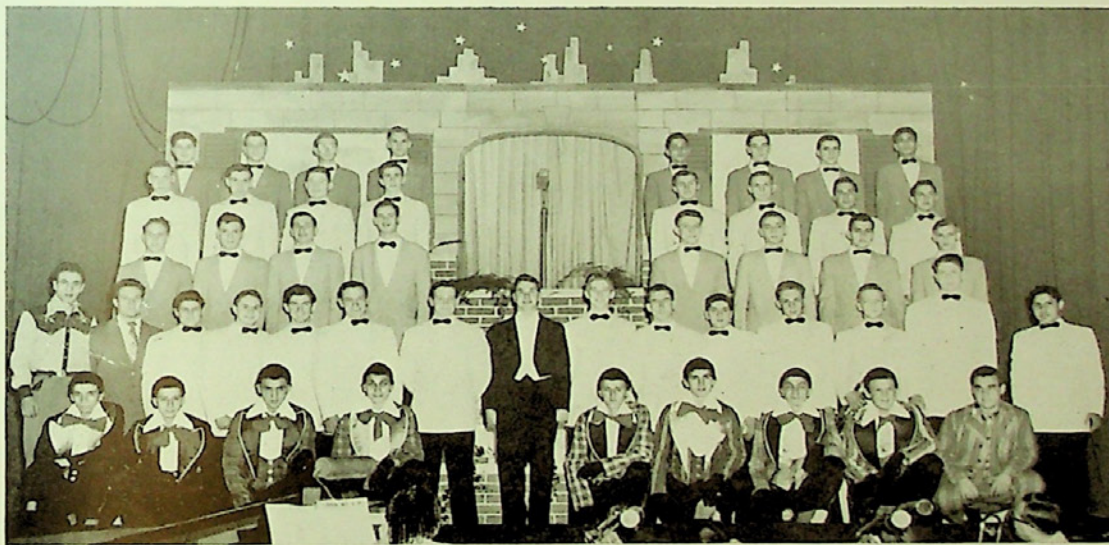
TECH MINSTREL

The second home game saw Bethlehem victorious over Roxborough High to the tune of 19-0. Joe Rich scored his fourth TD of the season in this contest.

In the waning minutes of the third grid battle, the Red and Blue scored to tie the Garnet and Gray of Phillipsburg, 14-14. The following week Butler's boys pulled another game out of the fire in the last five seconds and beat Hershey Industrial 20-14. Joe Rich starred again with all three touchdowns.



For the fifth game of the season, Bethlehem journeyed to Reading to meet the powerful Knights. Our boys suffered their first loss in a rugged game by the score of 26-21, Reading's first win over the Red and Blue in fourteen years.

However, the following week the Hurricane journeyed to Easton and walloped the over-rated Red Rovers, 28-7.

The next three games were at home. The Bethlehem gridders met no obstacle in Hazleton, beating the Mountaineers 33-6. The following week the Hurricane breezed over Allentown Central Catholic, 40-0. Perhaps the easiest game of the season was the Scranton Tech contest, as the Bethlehem squad went wild and literally ran Tech off the field to the score of 55-6.

On Turkey Day the Red and Blue of Bethlehem clashed with the Canary and Blue of Allentown on the latter's field, the first time Bethlehem played on the new A.H.S. gridiron. Both teams fought hard, but the Canaries came out victorious, 27-14. Austy Kurisco played a splendid game, but was injured in the third quarter.

The team of 1940 presented the award of "Lineman of the Year" for the first time. George "Skippy" John was the recipient.

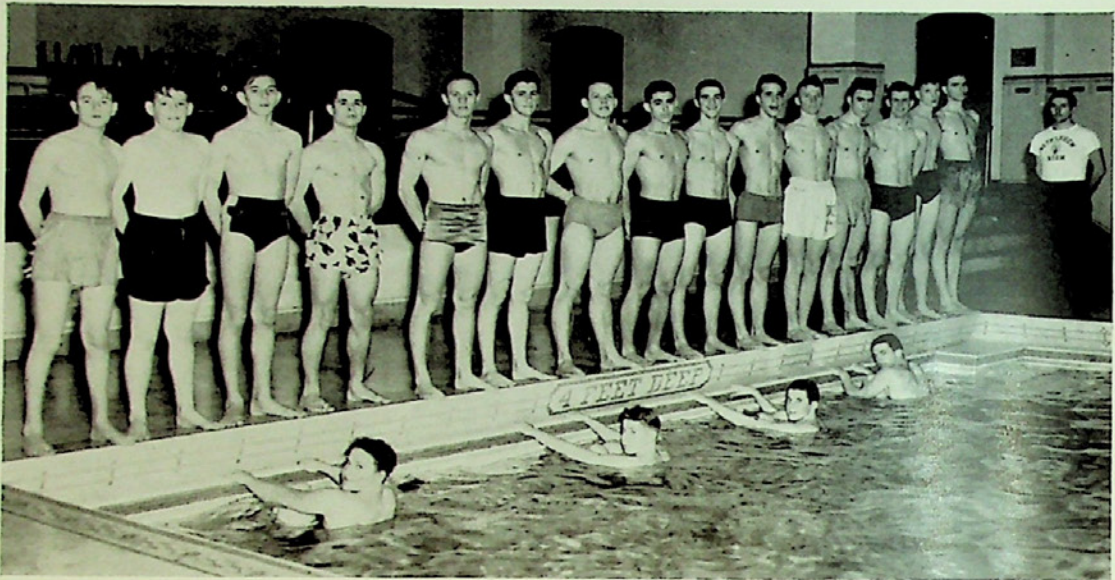

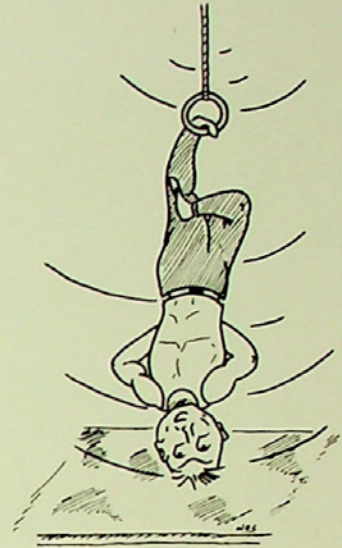


TECH TUMBLERS

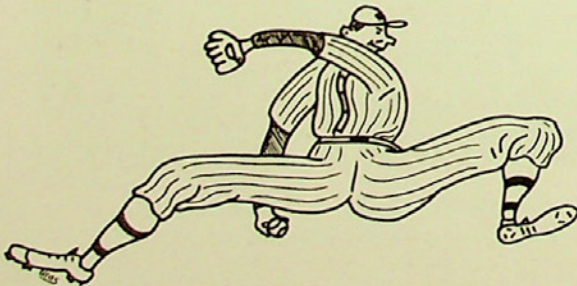
Coach Johnny Howard is looking forward to a good season, although he will need to rebuild the team in several spots.

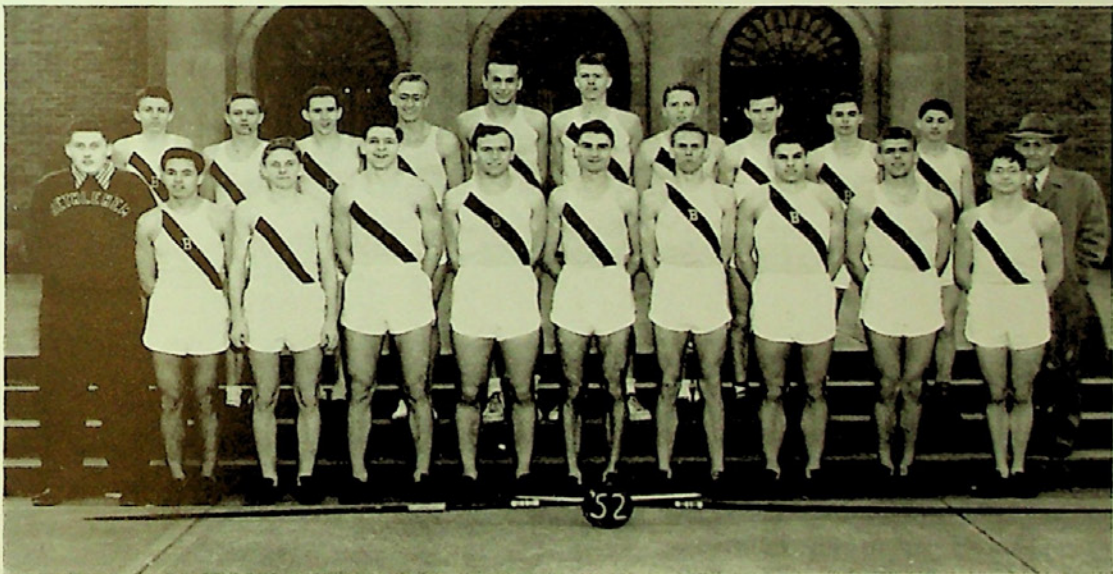

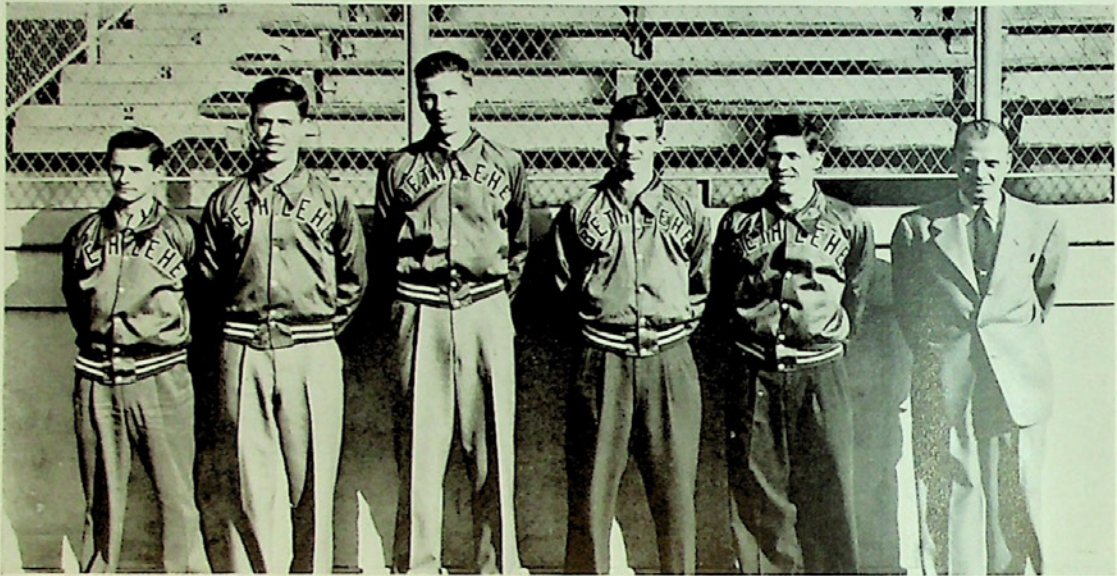
The hurdlers will be led by Tom Richards with Vic Kobordo, Ken Bateman, and Dave Preletz leaping right behind him.

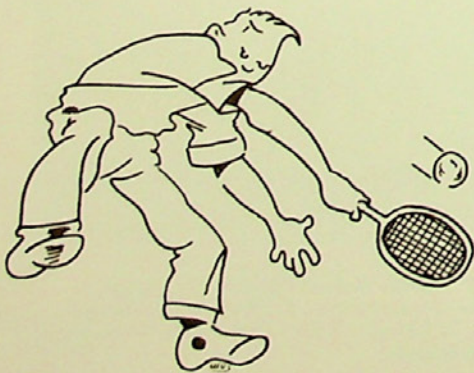
