patient. "When we receive battle casualties from the front, they ar-rive tense and nervous," she said. "They need quiet and to be made as comfortable as possible. The Army nurse must not only give the wound-ed patient good nursing care, but she must also help put his mind at ease by talking with him." When Lt. Heffner goes off duty at night, one may sometimes see her with a soldier's shirt or field jacket over her arm.
