"As a result of his courageous and persevering efforts," the c. ders say. "Lieut acore was enabled to report much valuable and timely information to higher headquarters, thereby materially assisting in overcoming the enemy's resistance.

"On one occasion, after he had been wounded, he unhesitatingly exposed himself to very heavy enemy fire in an attempt to rescue a fatally wound member of his patrol. The outstanding courage, devotion to duty and complete disergard for his own welfare displayed by Second Lleutenant Moore reflect great credit upon himself and his organization and are highly commendable."
