Only now has the War Department permitted the release of these names flashed from Red Cross stations overseas.

The 18 men from this vicinity whose liberation has become a certainty constitute a small portion of the 25,000 American prisoners of war who have already cabled word of their liberation to their families Feilbach (father), 522 Second Avein the United States. This special nue service affords, the liberated prisoner a chance to contact his relatives at home, with total expenses

borne by the Red Gross.

Messages from prisoners are accepted by Red Cross field directors at overseas stations and are relayed direct to Washington from where they are telegraphed on to local Per Cross chapters which deliver them in personal visits to the familles concerned.
