BAND AND ORCHESTRA

Two social events are held by the combined organizations during the year; a Halloween Party, and a Christmas Party which is given for those in the Band and Orchestra Mothers Club. Bethlehem has also had the privilege and honor of sending outstanding band and orchestra members to the District Music Festivals and a select few have been chosen as members of either the All State Band or Orchestra.





LIBERTY HIGH SCHOOL GLEE CLUB

The Liberty High School Glee Club, under the very capable direction of Mrs. E. L. Fitch and Mr. Carlton Weaver, is both an elective activity, in the sense that a student chooses to participate in it, and a selective activity, in the sense that all prospective members must have an audition with the directors to determine their musical abilities.

The boys and the girls in the club are organized and rehearsed in separate groups. In both groups, the officers are elected by students who have been in the glee club for two years. The girls glee club rehearsals are scheduled for Tuesday and Thursday after school from 3:00 p.m. until 4:15 p.m. The boys practice on Tuesday and Thursday before school at 7:45 a.m. and the fourth periods on Monday and Friday.

The two groups are combined for all Junior-Senior Assemblies in which the Lord's Prayer is chanted. The three big events as far as performances go are the Thanksgiving Program, given to the student body in November; the Christmas Vespers, given to the public just prior to the Christmas holidays; and the Spring Concert, given publicly early in May. Approximately two months before any one of these performances mentioned, combined rehearsals of both boys and girls begin both to integrate the choral singing and to add the necessary choreography and staging. The organization also participated in an exchange program with other school glee clubs in the area and travel to these schools to sing. The glee clubs also entertain local service clubs.

All is not work, however, in the spring an excursion is taken by the glee club, usually to either New

York or Philadelphia.

The Liberty Choraliers, composed of thirty-three members selected from the regular glee club, sings for church groups, civic clubs, and at other functions.

NATIONAL THESPIAN SOCIETY

A fairly new but very energetic organization with the aim to increase interest in all phases of dramatics is the Thespian Society which meets weekly in the "Green Room". Behind that green door just off stage right is a room that the Thespians have designed and improved as one of their many projects. It contains a makeup table complete with makeup lights, storage for costumes and props as well as stage equipment. CHESS CLUB


(RED AND BLUE KNIGHTS)

LIBRARY CLUB

With the smallest membership in its twenty-year history, the Library Club, under the leadership of Mrs. Margaret Randt, school librarian, has been one of the busiest groups in Liberty High School. The Club was organized in March, 1938 with the same two-fold objective toward which it still aims:

1. To help students better understand the Library and the many services it offers. This is accomplished to some degree in sophomore library orientation classes, but Library Club members have an opportunity to study the library in greater detail; to get behind the scenes and discover how the library operates, what makes it operate that way, and why.

2. To try to interest students in Library Science as a vocation. Professional library training institutions can't begin to meet the demand for librarians — not only in schools, but in many specialized fields as well — industry, medicine, armed forces, technology, government, etc. Practical experience gained by Library Club members as a result of their assignment to such routine tasks as shelving books, reading shelves, mending books, checking mail, handling circulation, processing new books, setting up displays, etc., gives them a preview of a career in library service, and may encourage some of them to choose this field as their life's work.

The Library Club meets fourth period every Friday, and activities vary from week to week. The

first Friday of the month is a business meeting; the second, a work period; the third, a program meeting; the fourth, a reading period; the fifth, when we have five, is devoted to a study of some aspect of library service — Dewey Decimal Classification system, card catalog, arrangement of books, reference books, etc.


Through all activities carried on during the year, the girls received valuable information and grew to understand the teaching profession more fully.


OFFICERS

AUTO MECHANICS

Since the automobile is one of the most important forms of transportation in the world. There will always be a great demand for well-trained automobile mechanics.

The boys who come to the Vocational Department and take the course in automotive repair work get the best of training that is possible in the limited time available to them.

In the sophomore year the students are guided by Mr. Leidig in theoretical practice and theory for one half year. Then they are transferred to the auto body shop so they can make a selection of



The juniors get more difficult jobs than the sophomores, but sometimes the sophomores help the juniors in their work. The juniors learn theory also, but they are allowed to help instruct the sophomores in their shop. The jobs that the juniors do are relining breaks, carbon valve jobs, overhauling engines, and tuning engines.

In the senior year the boys are fully trained. Their training is not too extensive, but enough to get them good jobs and learn more. Consequently the reason for this is because there are so many new things to learn about automobiles, and so they are constantly being improved and made more difficult to understand.

In the senior year the boys are given a chance to prove their ability in automotive repair work by actually going out on jobs at automechanical repair shops and earning money.

Mr. Leidig with the guidance of the juniors and seniors is doing a wonderful job to train the new students in this expanding field.







DRAFTING

Drafting opens the door for many young boys to a very bright future. Through the realm of drawing man now has learned many different methods to harness the powers of nature.

The need for engineers is very great. The need is so great that when a person takes an engineering course and applies himself accordingly he will be amazed by the job opportunities which are offered to him.

The teachers of the Vocational Department of Bethlehem High School knowing, the need for engineers, have striven to guide many students into the field.

The Vocational Department is proud to offer the boys three well-equipped drawing rooms, a blueprint and a discussion room. The boys have a choice of three different types of drafting. These include the following: mechanical, structural, and architectural drawing.

In the room which is under the direction of Mr. Alexander, the first year boys are taught the fundamentals of drafting which include the following: printing, functions and the uses of the instruments, pattern making, orthographic projection, auxiliary views, oblique projection, and the detailing of different machines.

In another room which is taught by Mr. Dubbeling, the junior and senior boys are taught structural drawing. This deals with the framework of a building. Upon taking this course the boys learn the standards and some non-standards used to connect different members of the building. The boys are given a month's period for the opportunity to learn the fundamentals of architectural drawing. They also learn ink drawing and the making of blueprints.

In the third shop under the direction of Mr. Andrucci, the boys learn mechanical drawing. This course entails many related phases of detailing. Most people think it deals only with the detailing and assembly of machinery, however, in general engineering plants, a mechanical draftsman must

be versed also in the principles and uses of foundations, concrete formations, welding, piping, jigs and fixtures, gearing, uses of catalog standards and many other related types of drawings.

At the time of graduation the boys should have attained to a certain degree these fundamentals which are essential assets in helping to become a better citizen in the community.



ELECTRICAL SHOP

Electricity is a strange thing. If you touch a bare wire it can be felt, but you cannot see it in motion. It is like a river, it takes the shortest path to reach its destination.

The training at the Vocational Department is split up into three years of learning and during these three years Mr. Risbon, who is the instructor, spends tiring hours trying to teach us about electricity.

The first year one learns the fundamentals such as series circuits, parallel circuits, different kinds of tools, and simple set ups with batteries as power.


The second year the subject starts with motors. One learns the different parts of motors, operation principals and how to hook them up. The types of motors dealt with are: series, shunt, polyphase and compound.

The third year one learns more about motors because it is too big a field to cover in one year. In addition to motors the course also covers rheostats, speed controllers, and relays.

While absorbing this knowledge the students also do repair work on motors, mixers, toasters, drills, lighting, circuits, and the machinery in other shops.







PRINT SHOP

Printing or the lay of ink on paper for a variety of purposes is done through several different processes. Letterpress, offset, gravure, and silk screen are the major ones. Printing today employs hundreds of thousands of workers. Printing ranks third among American industries. The modern world could not be what it is today without printing for everyone depends on it. Printing is also known as "the art preservative of all the arts," and is one of the greatest factors in the promotion of human progress and development.

Johann Gutenberg of Mainz, Germany invented the first movable metal type for printing in 1456. His first known work was the "Bible of 42 Lines." From the Chinese invention of paper in 105 B.C. to the invention of movable type by Gutenberg in 1450 A.D. to the high-speed paper and type machines of the present all strive to meet our daily printing demands. Benjamin Franklin is the best known of early American printers for his publication called "Poor Richards Almanack" and his "Pennsylvania Gazette" which later became the "Saturday Evening Post."

Our Vocational print shop consists of a composing room where the copy for the jobs of printing are received, and the type is set, and assembled into forms. In the composing room there is a darkroom and camera used for platemaking.

In the pressroom the type forms are locked up and placed on the presses, made ready, and printed. In the bindery such operations as folding, stitching, trimming, punching, and perforating are done.

When the students graduate from the print shop, they have all the fundamentals necessary for placement in a commercial print shop. Mr. Hunsinger and Mr. Bucchin have done a splendid job in imparting their knowledge to their students



MACHINE SHOP

The machine shop prepares a student for his apprenticeship in industry. In the shop you learn to be versed in the skill of using all the different machines and the precision machine tools with accuracy. The machine shop is the largest shop in the vocational department. It is also one of the best equipped. Our machines are the same type found in any machine shop. With the addition of eight new milling machines, two lathes, surface grinder and many new precision instruments our shop's capacity and versatility has increased. The shop has a capacity of over sixty working stations. The shop is conducted in the same manner as the shops in industry. Besides the practical work on the machines the students see movies on the latest methods of machine work. Great emphasis is put on safety, and the



students are well instructed on safety in the shop. Although it is a dangerous shop, there are rarely any accidents. Mr. Rhoads and Mr. Cacciatore are our shop instructors. They have attended college and have completed there apprenticeship at the Bethlehem Steel. Our shop also has a student council which is the ruling body of the shop. There are two seniors, two juniors, and two sophomores from morning and afternoon shop, elected to the student council. They discuss the problems of students and the manner in which the shop is to be run. It is also their duty to plan the extra activities. Besides shop basketball, which is an intramural sport in which all shops participate, we have the Christmas party. At the end of the school year we have the machine shop banquet which is a happy annual event. It is a semi-formal affair and students bring their dates. We also have a summer picnic which is held at a park where we can play baseball or enjoy other outdoor sports.





WOODWORKING

Since mankind has been upon earth wood has always been in use. Wood is used to construct homes, factories, furniture and many other things. Many other products are derived from wood. In some places it is still the chief product to keep people warm, and it provides a good fuel for them. Without wood mankind could scarcely get along.

In the woodworking department at Liberty High a boy spends three years learning his trade. In his first year he learns how to recognize different kinds of lumber, how to make different kinds of joints and how to distinguish the many different tools. Sanding properly is the final thing he learns in his first year. In his second year he learns how to run every machine in the shop. Some of the machines are the surfacer, jointer, radial, circular, jig, and band saws, lathes, shaper, mortiser and sander. With the knowledge of these machines, he should be able to do a good job because learning to use them properly will save a great deal of time and also adds to safety. In his third and final year he helps the first year boys along. He takes on the responsibility of the most difficult jobs in the shop. Along with the assistance of Mr. D. L. Detwiler, woodworking instructor, a boy should have a good idea of woodworking when he graduates in his senior year.

Yes, woodworking will never go out of existence. Even though steel is very good in building plants and factories, without wood, the building could never be completed. Mankind cannot survive decently without wood and its many uses.

Mr. Detwiler has been teaching vocational woodworking for thirty-three years. After graduating from Altoona High School, he graduated from Penn State University where he obtained his B.S. degree in industrial education.



ELECTRONICS

Electronics is the study of the electron. The electron isn't something new; it has been a part of our existence since time began. The paper upon which this book is printed is made up of electrons.

The electron was discovered by Professor J. J. Thompson. The idea of the electron has changed since then, but this is where the electron got its start. From this discovery radio, television, and many other marvels were developed.

In the electronics shop we study the application of the electron to modern day communication. That is to say radio and television. No one man can be accredited with inventing or discovering this

means of communications. It took time and teamwork of countless men to bring about this human asset we know as radio and television.

Communication as we know it today cannot be isolated. Adverse weather conditions no longer control this vital aspect of human living. The flip of a switch and a man's voice travels thousands of miles.

Our instructor, Mr. Hartmen, possesses the ability to make students concentrate on what he is saying. His ability to teach a subject of such great complexity has won him the admiration and respect of many students.

In the sophomore year the student studies radio theory. He also studies formulas and equations which he must know.

During the junior year the student studies the electron tube and its characteristics. Later in the year, when the student feels he has mastered this, he proceeds to study the different parts of a radio, such as amplifiers and power supplies.

During the senior year, the student studies the receiver as a whole. He also studies servicing procedures. This process of taking a useless radio and making it work.





AUTO BODY SHOP

Auto body work which is taught by Mr. Vallone provides a great future for the students much like the automotive repair shop.

Each and every day there are hundreds of accidents and if it wasn't for the body shops these cars would be junked and the owners would have to spend thousands of dollars to replace them.

In the sophomore year, Mr. Vallone assists the students in theory work in which they learn all about tools and how to use them properly. They have to learn all about this in a half a year because they have to make an informed selection in their junior year when they will stay permanently in their shop.

Each student is then assigned to some junior or senior who instructs him in doing his job. The sophomores are taught how to sand, straighten frames, align panels, and how to bang dents out properly.

The juniors are required to know more, and they don't need so much assistance from the seniors and the instructor as the sophomores do. They have to know how to lead in hollows which cannot be banged out. And they have to know about torch work such as: welding, soldering, leading, and sprinkling.

In the senior year the student has a vast knowledge of auto body work. They know how to spray cars entirely and how to straighten out badly smashed ones without hardly any assistance from the instructor.

Around the second semester they are allowed to go out on jobs, if their class work warrants it.

The auto body shop also has vast fields slowly being improved and soon will be used extensively. One of them is the use of fiber glass in making the bodies of cars. This product is not fully improved yet so it is just in an experimental stage.

The body shop has wide possibilities in which Mr. Vallone is doing a fine job of instructing the students.



BUILDING TRADES SHOP

The Building Trades course consists of different trades which have to do with construction.

These trades are: bricklaying, carpentry, plumbing, electricity, painting, plastering, and heating.

In this shop we learn all of the above trades.

The carpentry course gives us an opportunity to learn how to put up roofs, such as, the *hip roof*, *gable roof*, and the *shed roof*. They are also learning to do all the carpentry necessary in building a house.

In the electrical course the boys put outlets in a sample house which they have built themselves in shop, and also they put in electrical wiring throughout the house.

Mr. Earl Snyder, the shop instructor does a fine job teaching the boys the fundamentals of the shop courses. Previously, Mr. Snyder was an instructor at Phoenixville Vocational High School, and just started teaching at our new school this year.

Building Trades is a new course that started this year, in the new Vocational Building. It is a wonderful trade to get into if you want to build your own home.


It provides a good future in many ways, because there is always a job for a good carpenter, bricklayer, or electrician. Of course these are all jobs that pay well.

If a boy is willing to learn he can make a good tradesman of himself and will have no trouble in securing a good position.








GENERAL METAL WORKING

This year for the first time the Vocational Department has introduced a new shop called, "General Metal Working." Included in this shop is a phase of fabrication for shop students and the related shop drafting students. General metal working is the working with all kinds of sheet metal. Every student in the shop works with the different types of equipment and tools necessary to complete a job. They also learn how to break a job down to easy step-by-step instruction. Before the student does any actual work, he must learn the fundamentals

of metal working such as, soldering and riveting. He must also learn how to operate the different machines which are used to bend the metal into different shapes and put different designs on whatever he may be doing. The fabrication department of this shop is the art of assembling beams, columns, trusses, etc. Fabrication also teaches students to read and understand blue-prints. They also teach spot welding which is used to hold the fittings in place and hold them securely when shipped out into the field. In the shop burning and template making are also taught. Fabrication is given to all the drafting students because in their shop they detail the beams, columns, and trusses and in related shop they fabricate them. Upon graduation there is always a good placement in industry for the better student.








Bethlehem still shocked by the Milton Hershey defeat was tied by Reading 13-13. This was the first of the ties for the local eleven. The following week Easton delivered a 20-7 setback to a Bethlehem team plagued by injuries. DeWitt Clinton of New York fell prey to an angry Bethlehem eleven which pasted the boys from New York 35-12.



The local team was caught from behind and tied in its next two Bethlehem almost doubled the total yardage against the Scarlet and Gray of Phillipsburg but, the game ended in a 6-6 deadlock. A spirited underdog coal region eleven from West Scranton had to use a touchdown in the last ten seconds of the game to tie the Red and Blue 20-20.




The fifteen majorettes, under the advisorship of Miss Shimer, can be found practicing with the band two mornings a week during the football and basketball seasons.





Bethlehem High's soccer team excelled this year, kicking its way to an Eastern Regional PIAA State Championship.

To gain this honor they battled their way through a rugged ten game TriCounty League schedule, completing it with a nine win and one loss record, good enough for first place.
only setback was suffered at the hands of North Penn who finished in second place.

In non-league competition, Bethlehem lost a heartbreaker to Reading 2-1, and tied the TriCounty All-Stars 1-1. Injuries plagued Bethlehem during this phase of the season. Jim Welsh, halfback, suffered a broken ankle during a practice session while Doug Baillie starting left halfback, broke his leg during regular league play.

As a result of their fine league showing, Bethlehem played Kennett Square in the first round of state playoff competition. The Martz men gave Kennett Square a thorough drubbing, racking up a final score of 5-1. Greg Ruth, Fred Donatelli, John Koroyanis, and Howie Whitcomb provided the scoring punch. Lower Merion was the next inter district opponent in Bethlehem's march to the championship. Donatelli again led the way, scoring two goals as the red and blue booters dumped the maroon and white District 1 challengers 2-1.

Second-period goals by Greg Ruth and Earl Christman enabled the Martz men to nip James Buchanan of Mercersburg, 2-1, and to garner the first Eastern PIAA Regional State Soccer Championship in Bethlehem High's 34 seasons of play.

However, one out of three looks a lot better than one out of thirty-four. Bethlehem's forces have only been in a position to enter the playoffs three times, since they have only been a league member for that length of time.

The team finished the year with a 12-2-1 record, including the championship game. Sophomore John Koroyanis and senior Fred Donatelli combined to score 41 of Bethlehem High School's record 58 soccer goals. Koroyonis, who lettered his freshman year, set two scoring records. He tallied 23 times to break the 1954 record of "Skip" Rodenbach, and also notched 7 goals in one game to break the record held previously by Mike Kush.

Donatelli, who captained the squad this season, was second in scoring with 18 goals. Greg Ruth was number three man with 11 goals. Shelly Chamberlain, Danny Groff, Dave Grubbs, and Frank McCarthy contributed outstandingly throughout the year. The season gave Martz a won-lost-tied record of 55-16-11 for his nine year tenure as Bethlehem soccer coach. Since Bethlehem's entrance into TriCounty League play in 1954, Martz has won two of three circuit titles.

Those who remained unscathed, able, and willing were chosen for an All-Star Team which consisted of the following:



TRACK

The future's our own to do with as we please,


With such spirit as ours we can't fail.
