Pfc. Peter S. Kubat Seriously Injured In African Action

Private First Class Peter S. Kubat, son of Mr. and Mrs. Anthony Kubat, 917 East Seventh Street, was seriously wounded in action on March 30, "somewhere in Africa." This information was embodied in a telegram recently received by his parents from the War Department.

He was inducted into the military service on January 20, 1942, and was among the first of the U. S. soldiers to land in Africa. Before joining Uncle Sam's forces, he was an employe of the Bethlehem Steel Company.
