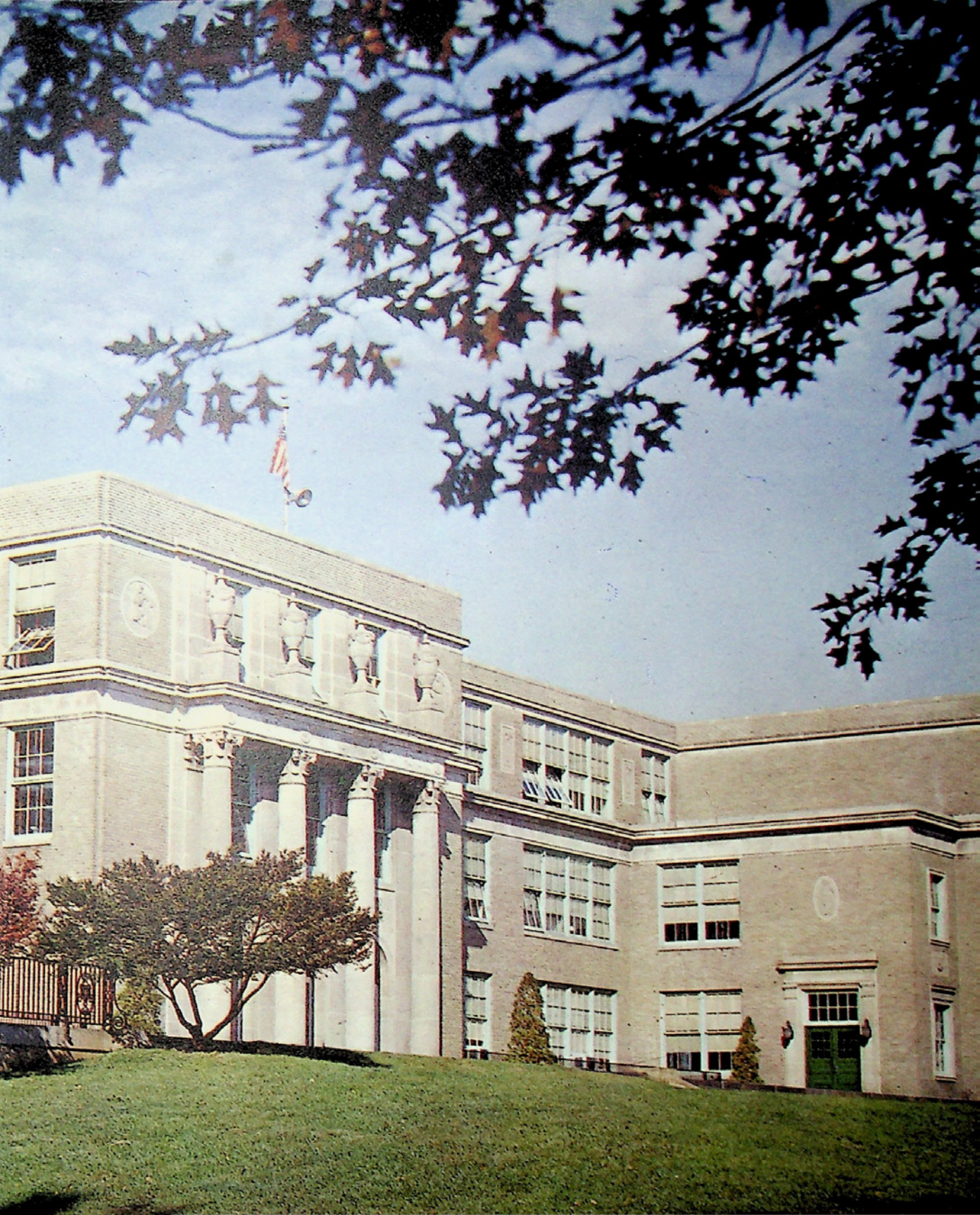

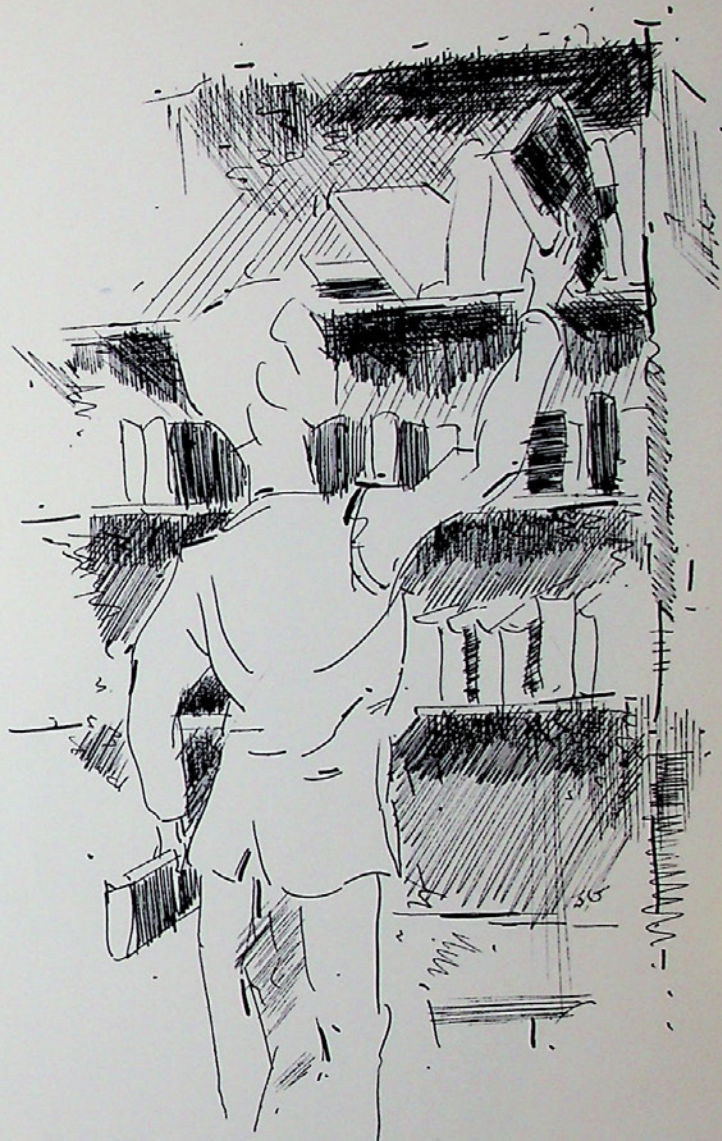

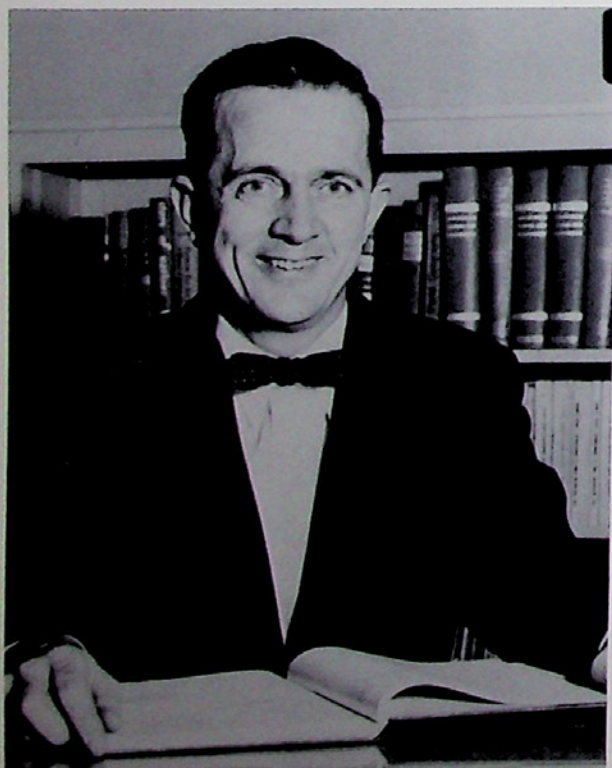




DR. CHARLES E. CHAFFEE

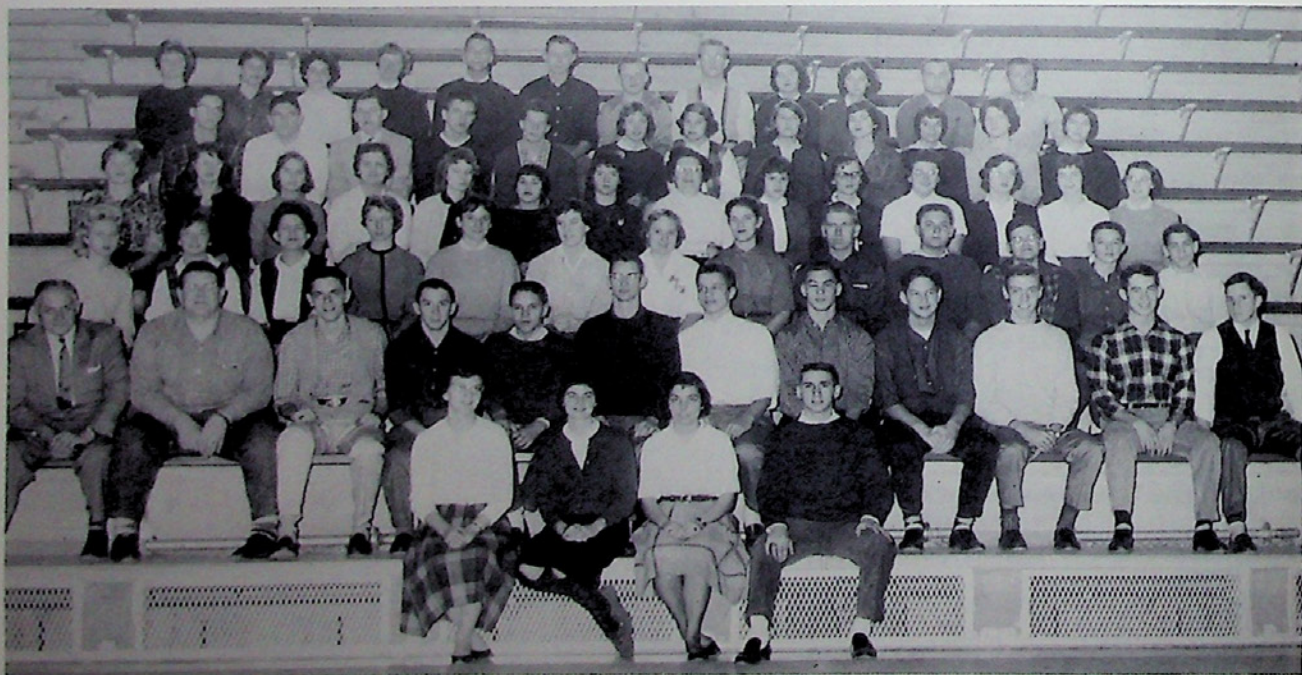
STUDENT ASSOCIATION

pledge. The troupe exchanged shows with neighboring groups and sponsored a trip to a Broadway show.

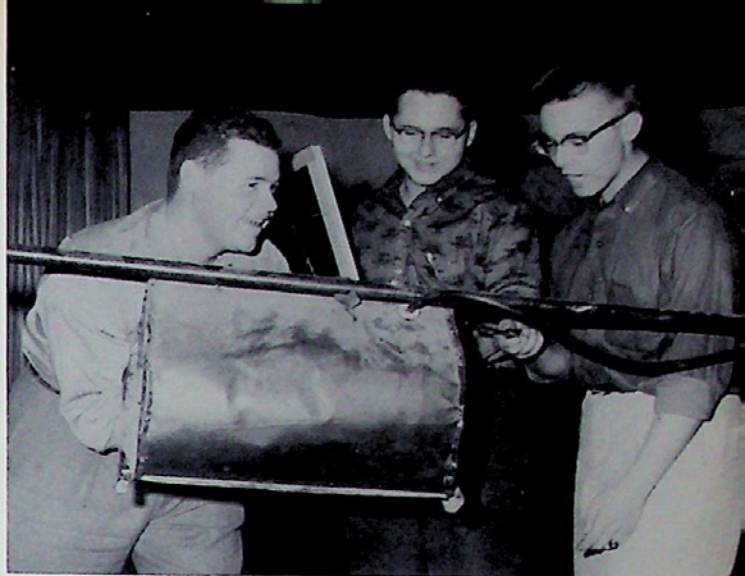

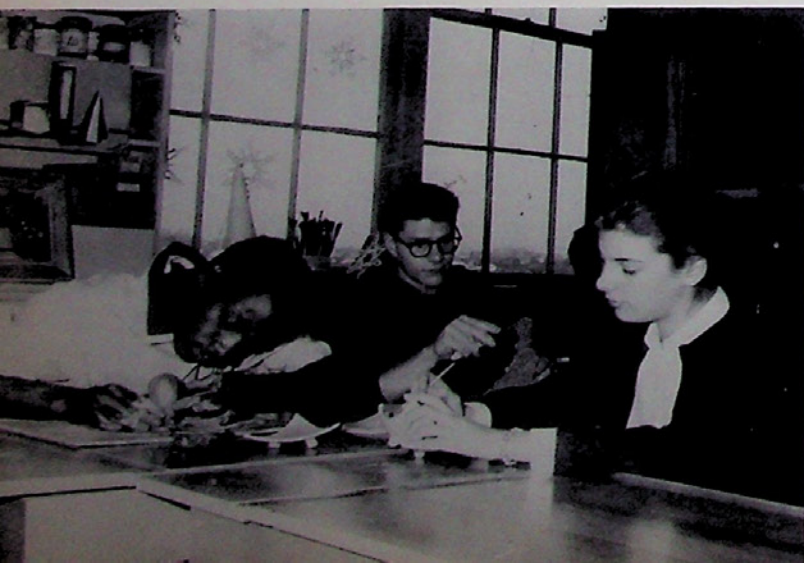

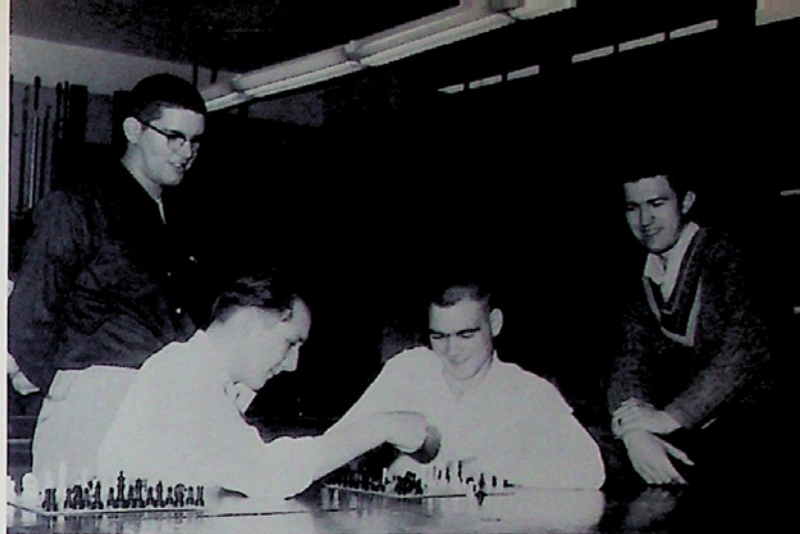

AUTO BODY SHOP

Increasing with the number of cars on the road is the number of automobile accidents. Because of this fact, the need for trained and experienced body repairmen is intensified. Mr. Vallone has the job of training these future auto body repairmen at the Vocational Annex.

In the sophomore year a student is taught the basic fundamentals of the trade, such as rules, terms, and use of proper tools. Becoming acquainted with the more difficult tasks is the purpose of the junior year. Seniors of this shop operate basically on their own with the occasional supervision of Mr. Vallone. They do welding, spraying and metal work. When the student completes his senior year, he is able to become an apprentice auto body worker.



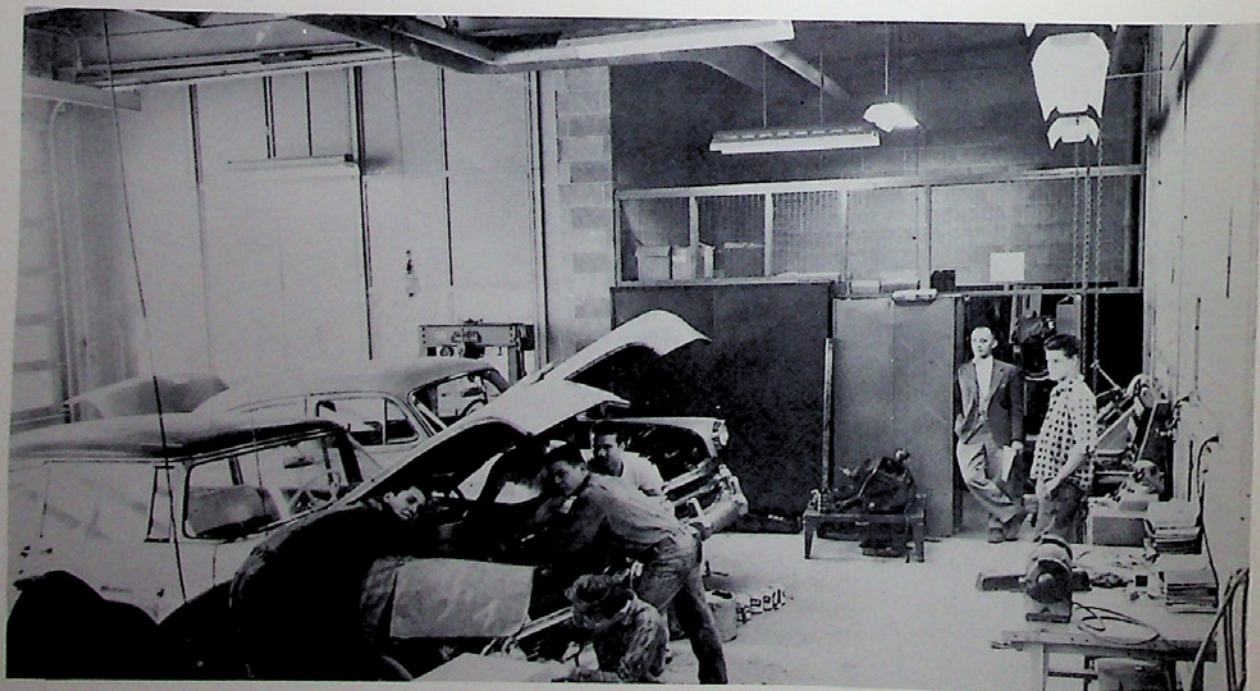
AUTO MECHANICS

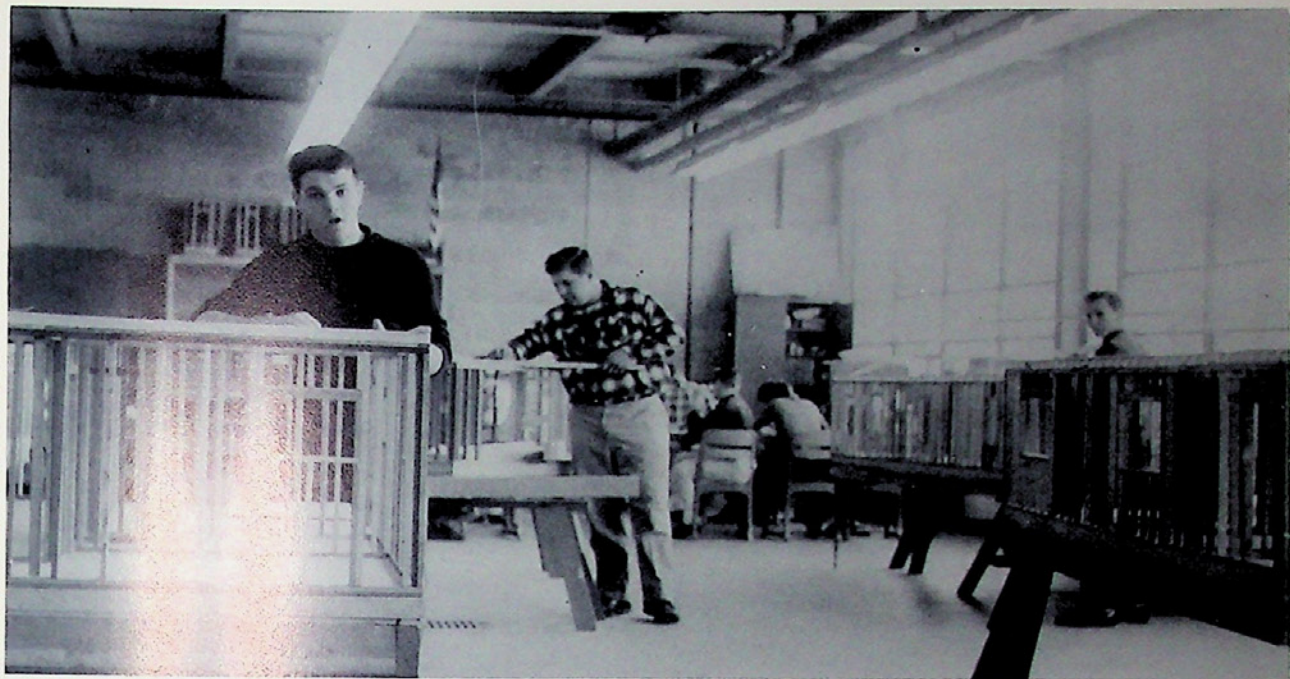


Since the number of cars on the road is increasing, the auto mechanics shop is of great importance. To give the best training in automotive repair work in the limited time available is Mr. Leidig's aim.

Sophomores are guided in theoretical practice for one half year and are then transferred to the auto body shop. During the junior and senior years theory is continued, and the students also reline brakes and overhaul and tune engines. Because there is much to be learned about automobiles, an auto mechanic's training is never complete.

Routine servicing, necessary repairs, and adjustments are made on cars belonging to the faculty, students, and their immediate families. Job opportunities in local firms are available to those students who successfully complete the requirements of the course.





BUILDING TRADES

Because of the constant need for workmen dealing with the trades, the building trades course taught by Mr. Snyder is very popular.

The boys in this shop learn every phase of construction work including designing and laying out a house, reading blueprints, building stud-walls, laying bricks, installing plumbing and heating units, and putting finishing touches on a building.

Students receive helpful experience, for they often get small jobs to do both in and out of school. Because of this practical experience, greater opportunities for employment exist.

Upon graduation from this course, the student has many jobs from which to choose. He may even continue in college and study engineering, but no matter what he chooses, he will have had a profitable education in an important trade today.





DRAFTING

Drafting is a graphic language used by engineers to express ideas and information necessary in industry.

Neatness, accuracy, and an understanding of mechanical and structural areas are all results of learning drafting under the supervision of Mr. Dubbeling, Mr. Andrucci, and Mr. Kach.

Two basic courses offered are structural and mechanical drafting. The study of drawing beams and columns and determining number and size of beams are some examples of structural drawing. Drawing of machine, tool, and gearing parts and calculating and using tolerances and finishes are a part of the mechanical drafting course.

Becoming familiar with the technique of expression, the correct use of instruments, and lettering is usually the first work studied in this course. Architectural drafting, a supplementary course, is presented to seniors.



ELECTRICAL-ELECTRONICS SHOP

Electrical and electronics courses have been combined to give the students the benefit of greater knowledge in both subjects. Since electricity plays a vital part in our civilization, this course is very important.

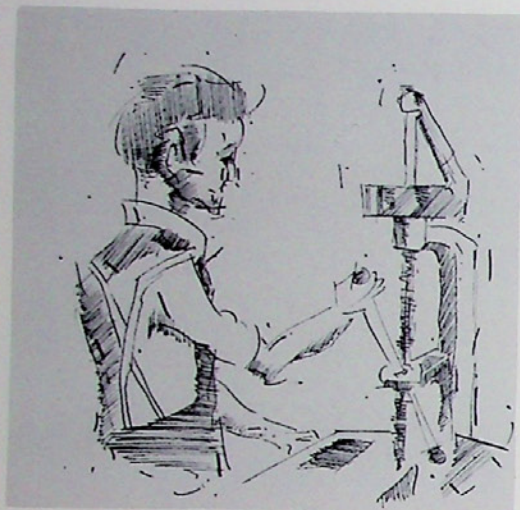
During the sophomore year, Mr. Neamand's program consists of learning the proper use of hand tools and the fundamental circuits. The students are taught how to read the many different types of instruments, since this is an important part of their future work.

In the junior year, Mr. Risbon's students learn the principles of motor action, armature winding, electronic controllers, and operation of generators and other electrical devices.

The senior program is conducted by Mr. Michaels who teaches the students more complicated electrical circuits, repair, maintenance, the theory of radio receivers, and the internal workings of different instruments.



MACHINE SHOP

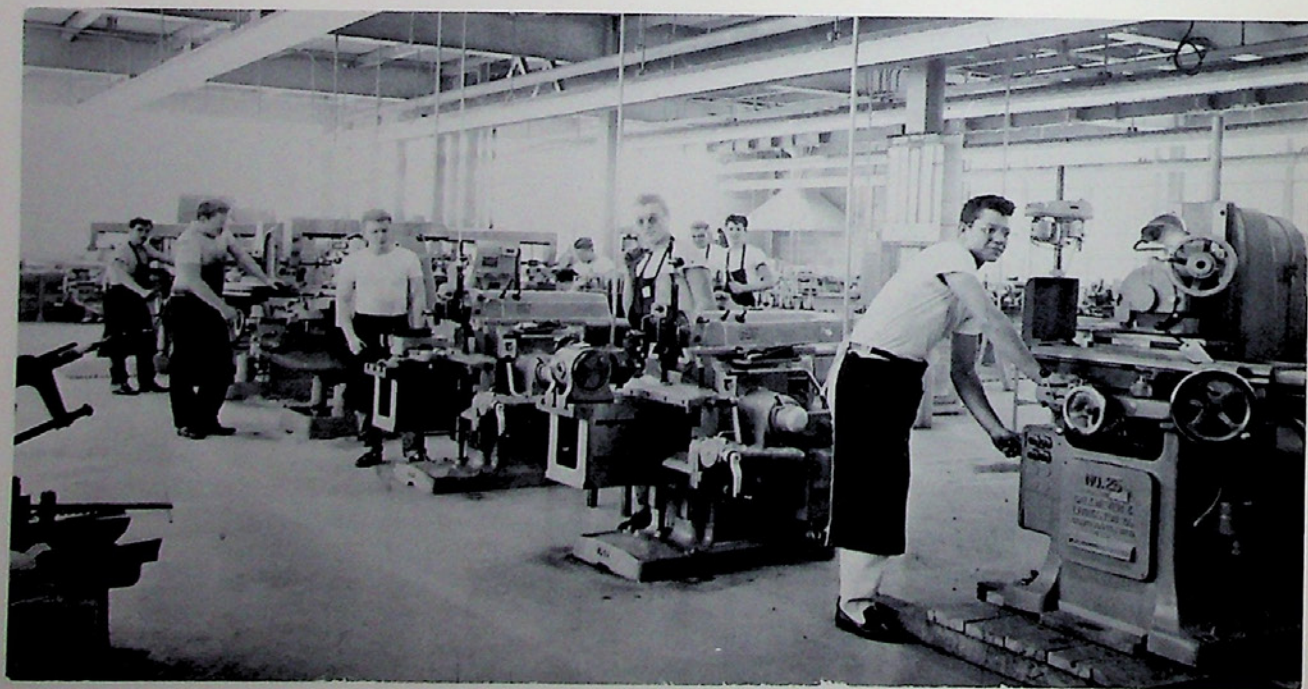


In one of the largest shops in the vocational department, the machine shop, Mr. Rhoads, Mr. Ross, and Mr. Cacciatore train students to become apprentice machinists.

In the sophomore year, students are taught the fundamental operations and workings of most of the machines in the shop. They are given a few simple projects which enable them to work and practice on the machines.

When the junior level is reached, students are expected to work with more accuracy and advance into more difficult operations on the machines. Students have enough knowledge by the senior year to operate all machines in the shop, complete jobs, and possibly work in a factory on a co-operative basis.

Evidence of the growth of this shop is the arrival of new machines which will make possible the introduction of courses in metallurgy.





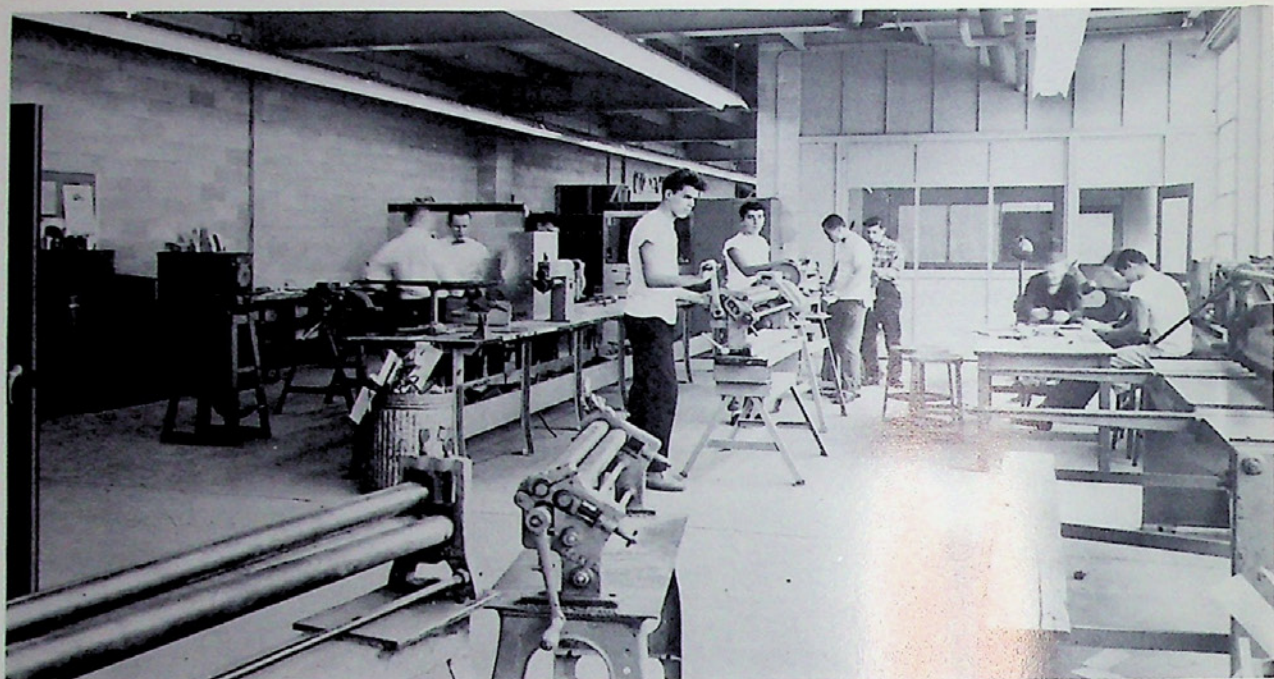
PRINT SHOP

Informing and educating people through magazines, signs, books, and newspapers is an accomplishment of printing. Improved equipment, methods of production, grades of paper and ink, and different type faces are being put into use daily, making printing a very promising and interesting career.

This shop consists of four departments: the composing room, the dark room, the press room, and the bindery. The darkroom, which is equipped with a camera, developing trays, light table, carbon arc, and other essentials and the composing room, where setting, proofreading, and preparing type are taught, are both under the direction of Mr. Bucchin. Mr. Hunsinger teaches techniques in the press-room and bindery. The different types of presses found in this shop, are platen, vertical, offset, and Kelly presses.

Upon completing the printing course, a student is prepared for employment as an apprentice in this growing industry.





GENERAL METAL WORKING

A relatively new shop is general metal working. Fabrication, sheet metal work, burning, welding, soldering, riveting and blue print reading are taught here. Mr. Dietrich, the instructor, emphasizes continually the objective of "Safety First."

Operation of crimping, bar fold, and rolling machines, along with soldering, are taught during the sophomore year. Acetylene welding and burning are taught in the junior and senior years; however, many years of experience are necessary before a student becomes adept at these skills.

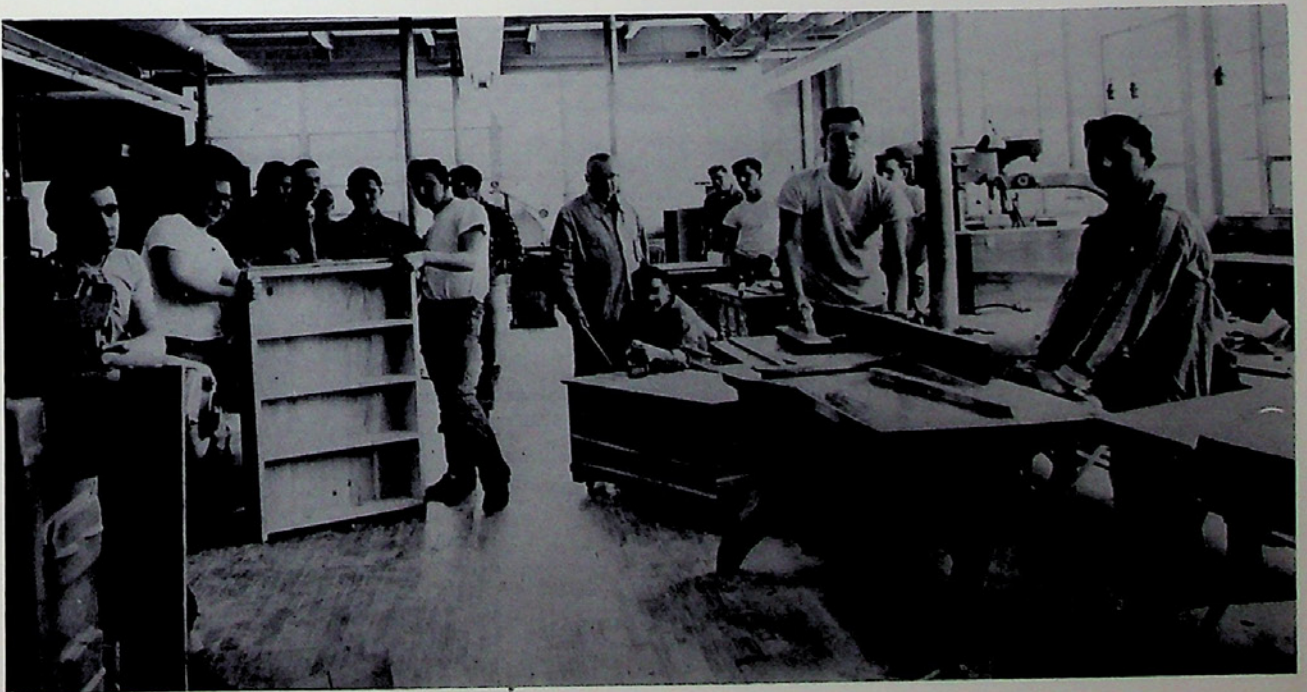
Before a student does any actual work, he must learn the fundamentals of metal working. Every boy in the shop works with the different types of equipment and tools necessary to complete a job. He also learns how to break a job down to a simple step-by-step process. Many jobs are available for those students who are experienced in general metal working.



WOODWORKING

Woodworking, one of the oldest trades in existence, has developed more in the last half century than in any other period of history. With the introduction of power tools, men have been able to make furniture more quickly and with greater accuracy.

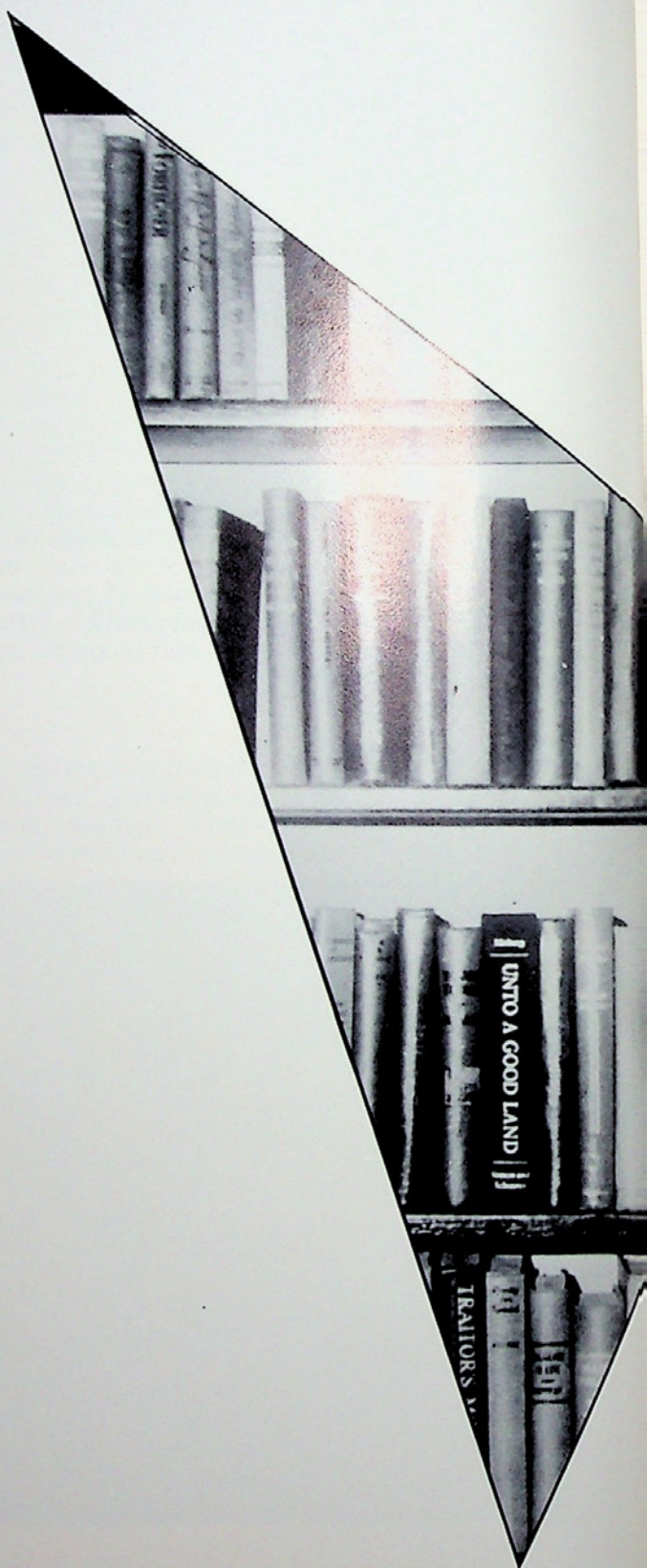
Students learn first to use the hand tools in making various types of joints. Coordination between the eye, mind, and hand are developed. When the use of the hand tools is mastered, the student advances to the power machines which he uses to help him learn the modern methods of cabinet making. Some of the machines used are the circular and jig saws, surfacer, lathe, power drill, and sander. With the use of the many machines goes the great amount of responsibility which Mr. Detwiler stresses. Woodworking is very essential and is known as a skilled vocation.

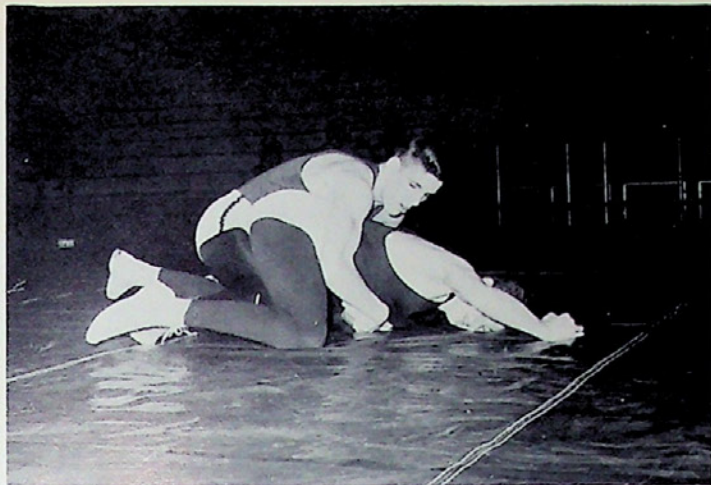
UNDEFEATED MATMEN GAIN LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP

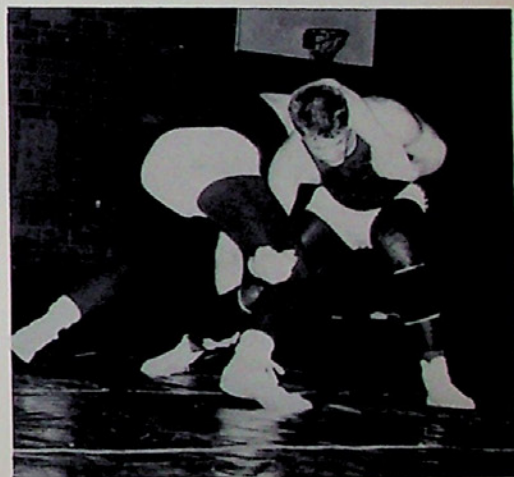

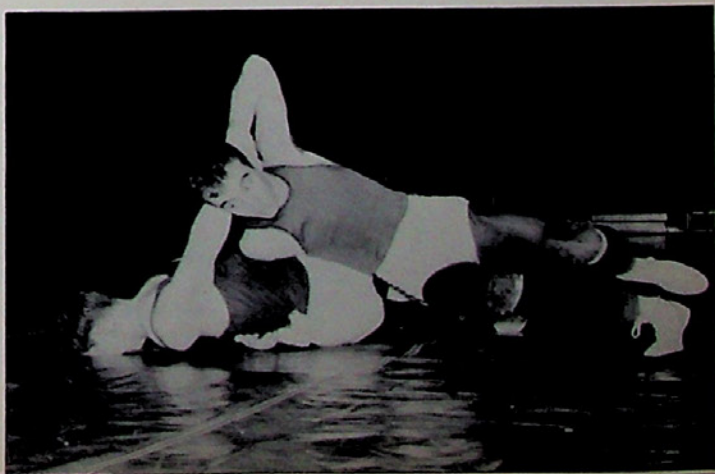

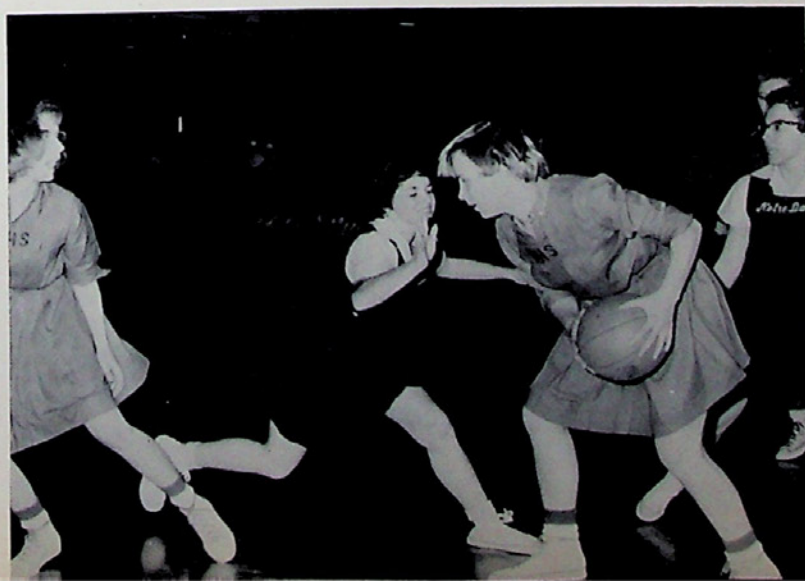

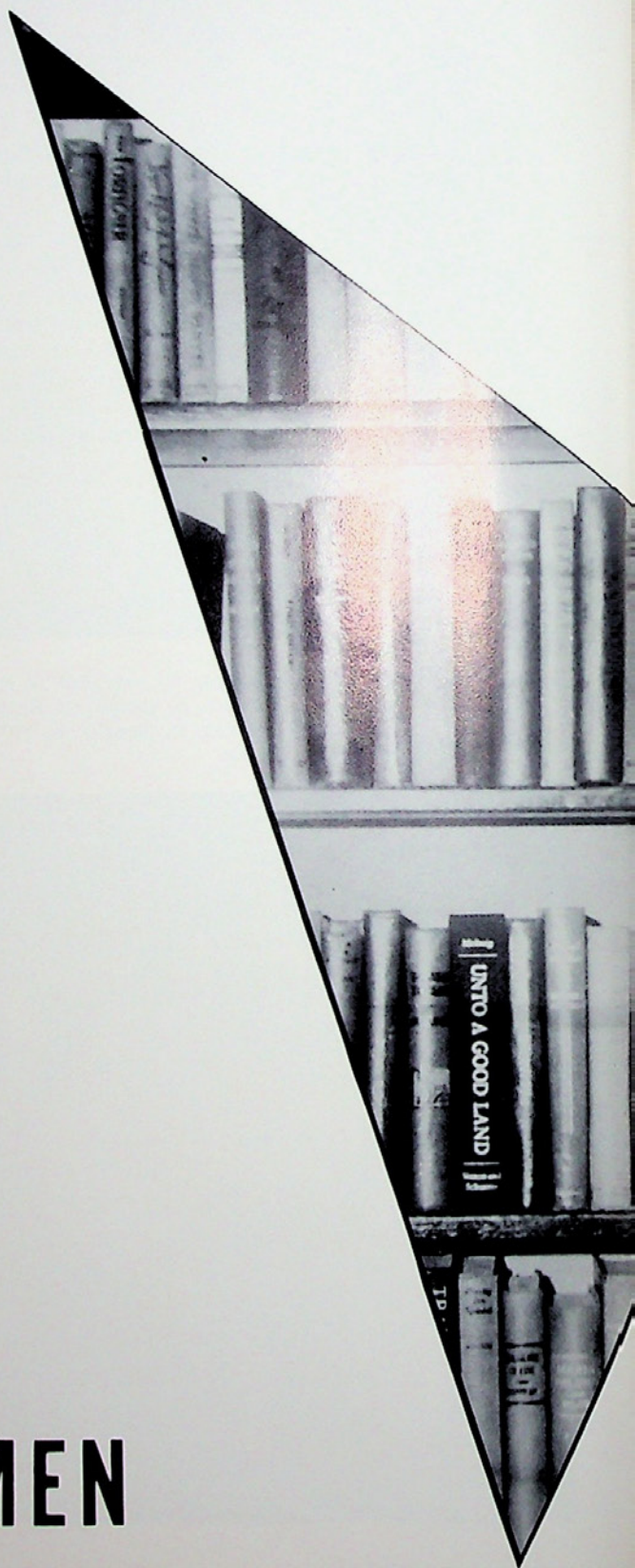

"Why won't this experiment work?" has puzzled many a curious Curie during an explosive lab period.



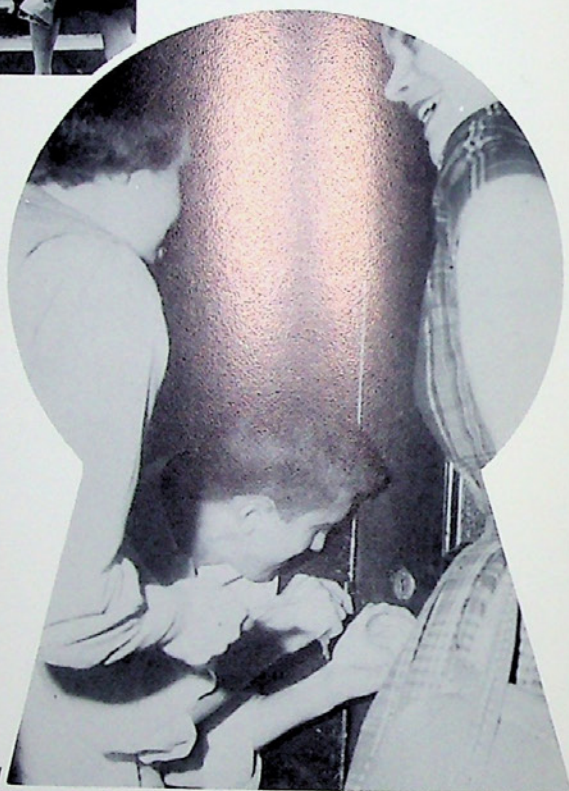
Easing the tensions of the day would be the dizzying "oopsy-daisy" of our newly-acquired trampoline in gym class.
