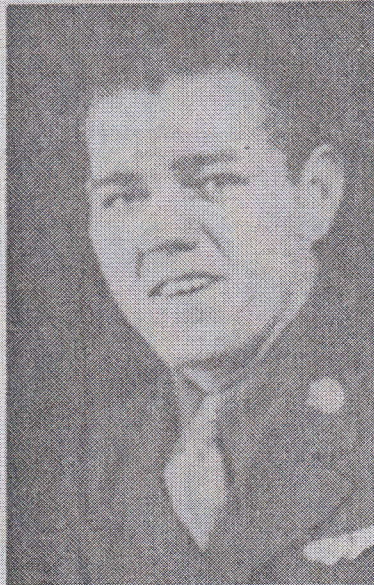
C. W. Raidline Dies Fighting in European Area

Staff Sergeant Charles W. Raidline, 25, of the U. S. Army Air Forces, was killed in action April 17 in the European theater of war, the War Department informed his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ryan R. Raidline, 23 West Fairview Street, Bethlehem.

The War Department in its telegram to the parents of the young man, who had been previously reported missing in action, said that reports now received from the German government and given through the International Red Cross reveal that Staff Sergeant Raidline died in action in the European area.

A veteran of the army service, Sergeant Raidline enlisted in August of 1935 and served continuously up to the time of his death. He went overseas last August.

He was a former Liberty High School student and a member of College Hill Moravian Church.

Besides his parents he is survived by a brother, Richard, of Bethlehem R. D. 1; two sisters, Mrs. Carl Chamberlin, of Bethlehem, and Georgia, at home; also a grandmother, Mrs. Charles Moan, of Bethlehem.
