Nazareth R. D. Soldier Killed On Okinawa

Pfc. Carl R. Remaley, 18-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Grant R. Remaley, Nazareth R. D. 1, was killed in action on Okinawa, May 20, 1945, according to an official message from the War Department.

Pfc. Remaley entered the service September 28, 1944 and was sent to Fort McClellan, Ala., for his basic training. From there he was assigned to Fort Ord, Calif., where he received his overseas orders to Oahu, Hawaii. Before going to Okinawa he was stationed in the Marianas.

A member of St. John's Evangelical and Reformed Church and Sunday School, he attended Nazareth High School and Bethlehem Technical High School. Prior to his induction he was employed by C. F. Martin and Company in Nazareth.

Surviving are his parents; a sister, Gloria, at home; two brothers, Earl and Sherwood, at home; two step-sisters, June Stump, at home, and Mrs. Chester Heimer, Cherry Hill. Three step-brothers also survive, T/Sgt. Harold Silfies, stationed at Tennessee; Herbert Silfies, Point Phillips, and Howard Stump, at home.
