CITY MAN SERIOUSLY WOUNDED IN ACTION

**Pfc. Harry Reis Is Casualty in
Africa Campaign, Parents
Are Told.**

The War Department has notified Mr. and Mrs. David Reis, 2146 Montgomery Street, this city, that their son, Pfc. Harry Reis, has been seriously wounded in action in Africa.

The War Department communication they received reads: "We deeply regret to inform you that your son, Pfc. Harry Reis, infantry, was seriously wounded in action in Northwest Africa on December 9. Period reports will be furnished when received. Adjutant General."

Pfc. Reis, graduated from Fountain Hill High School with the Class of 1937, was drafted September 25, 1941. Before his induction he was employed by the Jack Beckerman Co., Inc., Allentown.

At Fountain Hill High School, he played center for the basketball team for two years. He was sent to Camp Wheeler, Ga., where he received his basic training. He continued his training at Fort Bragg, N. C.

His parents recognized a picture of their son in action in the African campaign in the November 23 issue of "Life."
