**Gets Air Medal
For Part In Raids
With 8th Air Force**

AN EIGHTH AIR FORCE BOMBER STATION, England—Staff Sergeant Arthur J. Wolfe, 21, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Wolfe, of 17 West Morton Street, Bethlehem, Pa., has been awarded the Air Medal for "meritorious achievement" during Eighth Air Force bombing attacks on German military and industrial installations.

The B-17 Flying Fortress ball turret gunner is a member of the 493rd Bomb. Group commanded by Col. Robert B. Landry, of New Orleans, La. The group is a unit of the Third Air Division, the division cited by the President for its historic England-Africa shuttle bombing of Messerschmitt plants at Regensburg, Germany.

Sgt. Wolfe, a graduate of Technical High School, was a steel worker for the Bethlehem Steel Corporation before entering the AAF in July, 1943. His wife, Mrs. Lucille Wolfe, lives at 704 Seminole Street, Bethlehem. He was trained in aerial gunnery at Laredo, Texas, where he received his wings in July, 1944.
