Lieut. Lohm Fatally Hurt In Plane Crash

Lieut. John Harrison Lohm, United States Navy, was killed in a plane crash May 29 in the South Pacific, according to word received here by his wife, the former Rita Gilligan, daughter of John A. Gilligan of 513 Tenth Avenue. He was 27 years old.

Lieut. Lohm was graduated from the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis, Md., in February, 1941 and served from then until April 1943 in combat on destroyers in the Atlantic area, taking part in the Casablanca invasion and other engagements. He was then sent home for flight training and returned to overseas duty just a month before his death.

Lieut. and Mrs. Lohm were married in April 1942, shortly after the Army and Navy ban on marriages of West Point and Annapolis graduates for two years was lifted. Mrs. Lohm has been residing with her husband until he left again for overseas, when she returned to Bethlehem to reside with her father.

Lieut. Lohm is survived by his wife; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Albert L. Lohm of Kensington, Md.; and one brother, Lieut. (j.g.) Thomas A. Lohm, serving in the Naval Reserve.
