List Nazareth Paratrooper As "Missing"

Pvt. Harold R. Stoudt, a paratrooper, is reported missing in action since June 6, D-Day, according to a telegram received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Stoudt, 332 South Broad Street, Nazareth, from the War Department. The telegram stated that Pvt. Stoudt had been reported missing in action since June 6th in France. No further details were given.

Pvt. Stoudt, who is known to his family and friends as "Buddy," was nineteen years old on Jan. 2, 1944.

He entered the U. S. Army on April 22, 1943, and received his basic training at Camp Joseph T. Robinson, Arkansas, and further training at Fort Benning, Ga. He spent a seven-day furlough with his parents in October, 1943, and was sent overseas in the early part of November, 1943. He was stationed in England, North Ireland, Scotland and again in England, where he wrote the last letter received by his

parents, dated June 3rd.

He attended Nazareth High School and was a former employe of the Nazareth Paper Box Company.
