## Nazareth War Prisoner to Talk Of Experiences After Conflict

"After the war I'll talk about my experiences as a prisoner of war," said Pfc. John Viglione, South Whitfield Street, Nazareth, yesterday. He is spending a 22-day furlough at home.

He had spent 14 months in a prison camp in Italy and while there he met Pvt. James Mabus, Nazareth R. D. 3, who is also spending a furlough at home at this time. Both men will report to Camp Butler, N. C., upon the completion of their furloughs.

Pfc. Viglione enlisted in the U. S. Army on November 22, 1940. He has served with an infantry division in England, North Africa and Italy. In July of this year his mother, Mrs. Stephen Viglione, received a tele-

gram from the War Department stating that her son, Pfc. John Viglione, who was previously reported a prisoner of war had returned to duty and "undoubtedly he will write to you and state his whereabouts and welfare."

Pvt. James C. Mabus, son of Clyde Mabus, of Nazareth R. D. 3, and the late Mrs. Mamie Mabus, was a prisoner of the Italians and Germans for 15 months. He was wounded in the Tunisian campaign for which he received the Purple Heart. He was in an Army hospital several months before returning to the States.

Pvt. Mabus enlisted on December 12, 1940, and is in an infantry unit.
