Donald, 20, has been promoted to seaman first class aboard a battleship of the United States Navy now in the Pacific theatre of war. He is a gunner and is looking forward to the day when he is rated a gunner's mate.

The young sailor graduated at Bethlehem High School with the class of 1942 and enlisted at once in the navy. He was "among those present" when the invasion of North Africa was launched and saw action at Casablanca. He took his basic training at Newport, R. I., and was thereafter assigned to sea duty.

Walter, who is 22, is making good progress toward his second lieutenant's commission in the Army Airforce. He has completed his primary flight training at Maxwell Field, Ala., and is now at Dorr Field, Arcadia, Fla., for his advanced work.

The embryo flier enlisted January 30, spent five weeks undergoing basic training at Miami Beach, Fla., three months at Xavier Uni-

versity, Cincinnati, Ohio, was sent thence to Nashville, Tenn. for classification and then to Maxwell Field.

He is a graduate of Bethlehem High School, class of 1939; studied structural engineering, and was employed by the Western Electric Co. at Philadelphia and the Bethlehem Steel Co. prior to being inducted.
