### Lt. Fuenfstueck Enroute Home From Prison Camp

2nd. Lieut. Carl J. Fuenfstueck, who was liberated from a German prison camp May 1 by the Russians, was flown to France by the Eighth Air Force, is on his way home, according to a letter received by his mother, Mrs. Mary Fuenfstueck, 536 Broadway.

Lieut. Fuenfstueck was a fighter pilot on his second mission when taken prisoner eight months ago. He was last heard from in a letter dated December 17, 1944.

The flying officer entered the service as an aviation cadet in 1943 and was awarded his pilot wings in March, 1944. He has been serving overseas with the Eighth Air Force since June of last year. His wife, the former Miss Eleanor Bailey, resides at Tunkhannock, Pa. Fuenfstueck is a graduate of Fountain Hill High School and a former employe of the Glenn Martin Company, Baltimore, Md.
