Morris Efron Back In U. S. From Pacific

Lieut. (j. g.) Morris Efron, whose father owns the Rose Style Shop in this city, has returned to the States after serving as Naval intelligence officer in the Pacific area for 15 months.

Lt. Efron plans to resume his law practice in Allentown where he will be associated with Atty. Robert E. Haas with whom he was associated for more than six years until entering the service as a Yeoman 3/C in December, 1942.

Commissioned an ensign in 1943, Atty. Efron received his present rating while on duty in the Pacific. Specializing in Japanese language work, he was assigned to duties which included living and working with Japanese prisoners to secure information. He prepared intelligence reports for the staff and fleet from these interviews with prisoners and from his translation of captured enemy documents. He was based at Pearl Harbor but was often flown to other islands in the area on special assignments. He returned to the United States a week before the Japanese capitulation.

Graduate of Allentown schools, Muhlenberg college and the University of Pittsburgh Law School, Lieutenant Efron is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Abe Efron of 311 S. 17th Street and the husband of the former Ethel K. Ehrlich. He and his wife will make their home in Allentown now that he will resume his law practice there.
