Cpl. DeFulvio Wounded in Italy Action

Word has been received by Mr. and Mrs. Carmen DeFulvio, 630 Hayes Street, that their son, Cpl. Camillio DeFulvio, has been wounded in action in Italy. A telegram from the War Department says the wounding took place January 7.

Cpl. DeFulvio was inducted into the Army in June, 1942, and received basic training at Fort George G. Meade, Md. He was sent overseas in October, 1942, and was stationed in England until the invasion of Africa.

Cpl. DeFulvio remained in North Africa from November, 1942, until October, 1943, participating in several campaigns. He arrived in

Italy in October, 1943, and his family received mail regularly from him until late December.

Previous to his induction he was employed at Bethlehem Steel Company in the No. 6 Machine Shop. He is a member of Holy Rosary Church and the St. Peter's Catholic Society. He is the second member of Holy Rosary Church to be wounded in action, according to reports.
