Oak Leaf Cluster Added to Honors Of Lt. Carcione

First Lieut. Anthony R. Carcione, 1917 Huntington Street, Bethlehem, now serving with a Thunderbolt squadron in England, has been decorated with the Air Medal and the Oak Leaf Cluster to the Medal for meritorious service in numerous flights over enemy occupied Europe. Word from England indicates today. The award was made by Col. Hubert Zemke, Commanding Officer in the name of Brig. Gen. Frank O'D. Hunter, Commanding General of the VIII Fighter Command.

Lt. Carcione received his wings at Foster Field after attending Randolph Field and the Spartan School of Aeronautics for his army training. He started flying at the Allentown-Bethlehem Airport while in his last year at Lehigh University.

In college he was a member of the varsity wrestling team during his Junior and Senior years and also active in college publications. After graduating he entered the employ of the Bethlehem Steel Company, and later enlisted as an Aviation Cadet.

Since receiving his commission, Lt. Carcione has been active in photography and boasts quite a collection of movie and still pictures, which includes many people in the international spotlight.
