**Pfc. Schaller,
Reported Missing,
Nazi Prisoner**

Pfc. LeRoy D. Schaller, attached to the 110th Infantry of the 28th Division, who was reported missing in action in January since Dec. 20 in Luxembourg, is a prisoner of the Germans, according to a card received by the parents, Mr. and Mrs. LeRoy R. Schaller, 604 South Hof-

fert Street, Fountain Hill.

The card was written on Jan. 9, 1945, in the German prison camp Bad Orb. Pvt. Schaller wrote as follows: "Dear folks: Again I am privileged to write home. I am well and hope you are the same. Write when you can and tell me all the news. How was your Christmas? Mine wasn't so good.

"Send all the sweet and substantial food you can and have Lorraine (his sister) do likewise. Don't worry about me."

Pvt. Schaller was graduated from the Fountain Hill High School in 1940. He attended the Forestry School at Penn State College for three and a half years. He entered the service in May, 1943, and a year later was sent overseas.

He is a member of Squadron No. 406, Sons of Legion, his father being a first World War veteran and a past commander of Fountain Hill Post, No. 406, American Legion. His mother is a past president of the Auxilliary of Post 406, and quite active in Legion circles.
