**Cpl. William Nagy
With Philippine
Liberation Army**

WITH THE XIV ARMY CORPS, Southern Luzon.—Corporal William Nagy, 23, who is the son of Peter Nagy, 1431 Phillip Street, is fighting with the Philippine Liberation Army under General Douglas MacArthur, Allied commander in the Southwest Pacific.

Overseas **JUN 15 1945** for 10 months, Corporal Nagy landed on Leyte on D-Day with his unit, the 85th Chemical Mortar Battalion. He also served with the "85th" in the siege of Manila, the storming of Ft. McKinley, and the walled city of Intramuros, as gunner with a 4.2-inch mortar squad.

He has been awarded the Philippine Liberation Ribbon with two bronze campaign stars by the Philippine Commonwealth government. In addition, he has been authorized to wear the Asiatic-Pacific Ribbon with four bronze campaign stars.

Cpl. Nagy attended Washington High School. Leaving school he worked for a year as an employe of Bethlehem Steel Corporation, before entering the Army on Dec. 21, 1942.
